Be Selective about the Toys You Give Your Dog

Dogs are tremendously "oral" creatures and they experience much of the world through their mouths. Depending upon the breed, some dogs can exert 150 to 450 pounds per square inch with their jaws.

As a result, we need to safeguard our dogs from chewing excessively (with their overdeveloped masseter muscles of the jaw) upon objects that can damage the gums and teeth. Neglected and bored animals can also perform destructive chewing that can damage oral structures and teeth.

Dog Allergy Symptoms: What's Causing Them and How to Treat it

He's scratching and <u>licking</u>, keeping you awake, ruining his show coat, and giving himself a handy excuse for breaking that stay. It's driving you crazy—imagine how he must feel.

We most often associate <u>allergies</u> with sneezing and respiratory problems in people, but in dogs, allergies are most often associated with the skin and gastrointestinal (GI) tract. About 10 to 15 percent of dogs with food allergies will have both skin and GI signs, and about 20 to 30 percent of dogs with food allergies will also have <u>itchy skin</u> from other non-food allergies.

GI signs are most often seen as:

- Loose stools, with an average of three a day
- <u>Vomiting</u> and belching
- A skin sign is usually itchiness, and it appears the same as itchiness due to other allergies

According to one recent study, nearly 8 percent of dogs presented to a referral dermatology practice had food allergies, which represented about a third of all the dogs presented there with allergic skin disease.

"Ears and rears" is sometimes used to refer to the characteristic location of itchiness, though it's actually a little more widespread that the presence of the second sec Objects that can hurt your dog's teeth include rocks, bricks, large branches, cage wires, some rawhide chews, and even toys, depending upon their composition.

Many chew toys or treats can fracture teeth, resulting in the need for endodontic therapy, restorative procedures, or extraction. Rawhide chews can damage teeth in anxious, aggressively chewing dogs or if manic chewing before the rawhide has a chance to soften.

Ask your veterinarian about which toy she recommends for your dog. It will depend upon your dog's breed, age, and size, but chew toys with some flexibility are generally recommended. To prevent teeth-damaging chewing resulting from boredom, make sure you provide good psychological stimulation for your dog as well as safe toys.

Dental wear and tooth flattening is also a normal function of age and has been reported in prehistoric fossil wolf skulls, modern-day wolves, coyotes, and foxes. Let's just ensure that we do not speed up the process by providing objects that are too hard and potentially dangerous to dental health.

regions. In one study, dogs with food allergies suffered from itchy ears in 80 percent of the cases (and in fact, only the ear was affected in a quarter of all cases); itchy feet in 61 percent; itchy groin region in 53 percent; and itchy armpits, anterior foreleg, or eye regions in about 35 percent of cases. Secondary ear and skin infections often arise from self-inflicted trauma from scratching and chewing. These infections must be treated along with removal of the offending food.


Some breeds, such as <u>Cocker Spaniels</u>, <u>Labrador</u> <u>Retrievers</u>, <u>Golden Retrievers</u>, <u>German Shepherd</u> <u>Dogs</u>, <u>Poodles</u>, and <u>Chinese Shar-Pei</u>, may be at greater risk for food allergies, though they can appear in any breed.

Allergies can appear at any age, but most dogs have been eating the offending food for two years before signs of allergy appear. Some develop signs as early as two months of eating the offending food, but allergic reactions are not something that normally appear immediately after introducing a new food. But once symptoms appear, their onset is often sudden and serious.

Most dogs react to one or two allergens; about 20 percent react to more. There's a greater chance that dogs react to animal products from the same species (milk and meat from cattle, for example) or from related species (cattle, sheep, and deer, for example).

Diet trials are inconvenient and tedious. But compared to your dog's discomfort, they're a small price to pay to identify the culprit. Unfortunately there is <u>no cure</u> for food allergies except to avoid the offending foods.
