“Get behind me Satan! You are an obstacle in my path, because the way you think is NOT God's way but man's.”

These are the rather harsh words addressed to Peter by Jesus in today's Gospel. Peter's 'crime' to warrant such a reprimand was his concern for Jesus' welfare who had just announced to his disciples that he was about to suffer and be put to death. However, it is also probable that Peter was thinking of his own welfare too. Like so many in his time the idea of a 'suffering' Messiah was not something he was willing to contemplate. He probably had his own agenda which was about his own position in the 'new order' to be instituted by Christ – meaning a position of power for Peter himself. Once again, the one chosen by Jesus to be a leader proved himself all too human. In fairness to Peter he would, in the end, prove himself worthy of the great calling he had received by giving his life in service of the Lord. What of US?

PLEASE BE AWARE

It is essential to be at the church 15 minutes before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

Please enter the church in the normal way and exit through the double doors at the rear of the church.

Important: Please sanitise your hands on entry into the church. Refrain from touching anything in the porch.

There will be no missals or hymn books and therefore no congregational singing during mass.

There will be no sign of peace.

Kneelers in the pews should not be used.

Receiving Communion: Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. Communion can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

Important: At Communion after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

There will be collection baskets for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

Please disperse as quickly as possible after mass.

Those attending Mass/ Services in Churches should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.

FACE MASKS are now compulsory in churches and places of worship.

Face coverings are to be worn in enclosed public spaces at all times.

They are also currently mandatory on public transport and shops and in supermarkets.

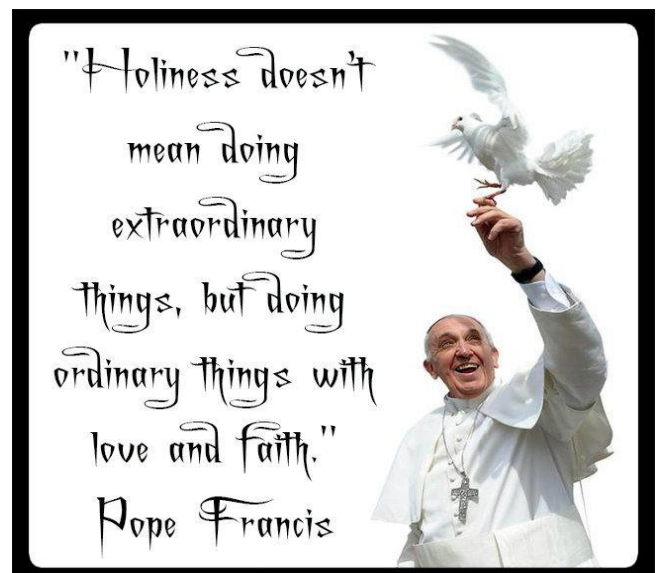

AIDAN'S PRAYER

**“Leave me alone with God as much as may be.
As the tide draws the waters close in upon the shore,
make me an island, set apart, alone with You, God, holy to You.
Then, with the turning of the tide, prepare me to carry your presence
to the busy world beyond, the world that rushes in on me,
until the waters return and fold me back to you.”**

St. Aidan, the Apostle of Northumbria, was the founder and first bishop of the Lindisfarne Island Monastery in England. He is credited with introducing Christianity to Northumbria. Aidan was born in Ireland. At the request of King Oswald, a missionary called Cormac, was sent to Northumbria but returned claiming he had no success in his missionary work. Aidan was then sent to take his place and worked closely with King Oswald, who is said to have acted as his interpreter.

His life of mission involved an enthusiasm for preaching, a concern for the poor and he was known for his charitable acts. He founded churches and monasteries, was involved in ministerial training and sought to strengthen the faith of those he encountered, however rich or poor. He travelled ceaselessly spreading the gospel to both the Anglo-Saxon nobility and to the ordinary people. Aidan gave his time, his respect and perhaps most importantly his love to those on the margins of society.

He is described as a humble man who was loved and respected and he died on the 31st August – in the year 651 AD. Aidan's life was a life of humility and a life of service which echoed the life of Jesus himself.
