

"And this is our top-of-the-line snow shovel, complete with a pair of defibrillation paddles."

I found this cute and OH SO TRUE comic which is perfect for a January reminder of another thing one can do to take care of your health. I doubt we can find a shovel like this in our local hardware store, but it gives us something to think about.

Inactive people at risk for heart disease should be warned about a potentially hazardous winter exercise—- snow shoveling. Indeed, four inches of heavy, wet snow on a 50 foot, 2-car driveway can weigh as much as four tons. Besides the hazards of frostbite and low-back strain, snow shoveling can be deadly.

Those who are over 45 years old who have a history of heart disease, symptoms suggestive of a cardiac problem (exertional chest pain, palpitations, dizziness) or major coronary risk factors (cigarette smoking, high blood pressure, elevated blood cholesterol and sedentary lifestyle) are at increased risk of

cardiovascular complications during strenuous

Use of this instrument for snow removal may be hazardous to your health

physical exertion. Persons with these characteristics would be well-advised to consult with their physician before shoveling snow, or hire someone else to do their snow removal.
