## "Adam was Here!"

Adam's Peak, in Sri Lanka (formerly Ceylon), is a mountain where, in Christian and Muslin tradition, Adam is said to have stepped down from Paradise to the next best place.

There's a stone tablet at its summit bearing the imprint of his giant foot. The Hindu tradition suggests that what we see is the stamp of Shiva's dance of creation; for Buddhists, it is Lord Buddha's footprint from his last visit to the island. A sacred site: Sri Pada. It seems language and religion shape what we see more than what might be there.

What about the Book of Genesis? Chapter 1 has the story of the six days of the creation of the world followed by the day of rest. A scientific account? Well, chapter 2 has a different account of creation! Can both be true? Can either be true? Isn't everything in the Bible true?

Biblical truth is based on the answer to the question: What was the intention of the sacred writer? For example, is the parable of the Good Samaritan true? The truth is in the message of the parable. The message of the creation stories in the Book of Genesis is that everything comes from God - not that this is the precise way that God made the world.
