Dear Friends in Christ,

"The seed sown on rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it." \sim <code>Matthew 13:23</code> \sim

In the parable of the sower, Jesus tells of a farmer who abundantly scatters seed in all directions. The path, the rocky ground, the soil choked with thorns ... all receive a generous handful of seed from the sower. This parable is not an encouragement to waste seed, but beautifully illustrates the lavish nature of God's grace in our lives. Against all odds, God freely sows words of love, forgiveness, hope, and restoration in our midst! It's God's gamble that the good seed of his Word will find a nurturing spot in our hearts, will put down roots, will send up life, will bring growth, and even fruit for the kingdom! But what if all those obstacles prove to be too much for the seed? What then? What will become of the seed?

In his parable Jesus identifies three potential obstacles to the seed's success:

- + The hard path reflects times when the Evil One steals away the hope and joy we find in God's Word.
- + The rocky ground represents times when our hearts aren't receptive to God's Word, so it can't take root.
- + The thorns depict earthly ambitions and anxieties that choke out any opportunity for the Word to grow.

Yikes! We can all relate to these scenarios at one time or another in our lives! Indeed, when we look within, we may see only obstacles to becoming the rich soil that bears fruit for God's kingdom. It's tempting, especially when life gets difficult, to see things *as they are* instead of *what they can become*.

Life in a world imprinted by a pandemic can feel rocky, thorny, and not abundantly fruitful. In visiting with folks, we sometimes hear expressions of worry ... "How will Covid continue to impact our lives?" "Will the Delta variant be a significant threat in our area?" "Will our congregational members return in strong numbers to regular worship and Sunday School participation?" "What if our church family never returns to the closeness we once shared?"

With swirling questions like these, it's good to remember that Jesus comes into our midst not just to recklessly scatter seed, but to

<u>remove obstacles</u>, as well. Whatever the obstacles you face as an individual ... whatever the challenges we face as a faith family ... we can rest assured that Jesus is ready and able to guide us through all we may be facing!

So...let's be bold and ask for Jesus' help...that we may become spiritually fruitful. Let's not become mired down in frustrating over what we may or may not be for the moment. Instead, let's focus on all we CAN BE in CHRIST...

Availing ourselves of opportunities to hear God's Word for us!

Opening ourselves in prayer to receive God's guidance on where we go from here!

Scattering good seeds of thought and deed, as abundantly and graciously as the Master Sower!

Trusting that the best is not behind us, but with the Spirit's guidance, the **BEST** is yet to come!

The seed sown on rich soil bears much fruit. This is God's Word for us! People of God, let's believe it and rejoice!
