Together we are making a positive difference in the neighborhood by bringing this active burial ground and historic treasure back to life. And, throughout Delaware, FHRC Volunteers and Community Partners continue to be recognized for their exceptional leadership and service.

WINTER READING

We have all made reference to Six Degrees of Separation—the idea that all living things are 6 or fewer steps away from one another so that a chain of "a friend of a friend" statements can be made to connect any two people in a maximum of 6 steps. This year we want to encourage more and more people and organizations to find their connection to Riverview Cemetery. And, if you are reading this newsletter you may be the link that is vital to bringing more people-connections to FHRC. So tell one another some stories, or forward the newsletters to friends, family, neighbors, colleagues, classmates, team members. We extend a warm welcome to you! There is something for everyone at Riverview Cemetery.

Over the next two months we will be equipping the interior space with basic furnishings and supplies and, we will establish new procedures. As we enter this next chapter in Riverview Cemetery's story, the former office/chapel will be called the Riverview Cemetery Visitor Center. Eventually our signage will encourage walkers and historians to enter the cemetery and enjoy its 42 acre greenspace spanning both sides of N. Market Street.
