NOTES FROM FR. VANDEWALLE

Sunday Reflection – "Ours is a time of turmoil and unrest. Sometimes we could wish that life in such times came with an instruction manual. The good news is it does; this Sunday gives us Jesus' own instructions for living in tough times." – Dr. Scott Hahn, (from St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology). Jesus, warned that there would be times like this, but He is with us through it. Even though at times it may look like or feel like things are falling apart, there are so many resources for hope given us by Jesus and His Church. One is the example of the Apostles who persevered joyfully, spending much time praising God, even in tough times. Two things they did were to continue to "work and pray" (Incidentally this was the motto for St. Benedict's Rule for his monks). This Sunday, St. Paul's letter to the Thessalonians reminded them to live an orderly life and do their proper work, not acting like busybodies worrying about everyone else's business. St. Paul, though he had a right to support from preaching the Gospel, nevertheless chose to support himself through work (probably tent-making) as an example to them to also do their work. Related to that balance of work and prayer, this week, I attended Fr. Schweiger's mother's funeral. Mary Jo was a spark plug of activity, working tirelessly for God and others, never seeming to sit still. There can be two extremes in viewing work. One where work just seems like suffering and is the opposite of rest. The other extreme is where someone works simply for the sake of work (or money) but ignores the health of his or her soul. It seems that Mary Jo had a good balance. The funeral homilist, Fr. Beardslee, suggested that for her, work and "rest" were not opposites because her work brought her peace since she was doing it for God and others. It is good to examine how our work fits into God's plan. When Mary Jo's priest son asked her if she was ready [to die], she said: Yes, I'm looking forward to the next adventure. Fr. Beardslee suggested that her "peace" in heaven would not be inactive, but she would be one who would "dart about like sparks" as indicated in the Book of Wisdom. The other thing that gives us hope in these times is prayer. Often praising God and listening to God gives us hope amidst turmoil.
