The psalm praises the wonders of God. The second reading speaks of the promises of God through the ages and the resurrection of Jesus Christ. In the gospel we hear how an angel appeared to Joseph and he did as the angel told him.


**Responsorial Psalm** – Psalm 24: "Let the Lord enter; he is king of glory."


