Acts 1: 14-26 Restored Apostle

16th May 2021



How do you make decisions? Are you impulsive or do you procrastinate, putting off making the decision as much as you can? This incident in the Bible led Jesus' apostles to make a decision.

It starts and finishes with prayer, but different kinds of prayer.

Prayer (1)

"All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer" (verse 14). The mixed crowd included 11 apostles, women and the mother and brothers of Jesus. The number grew to 120. Jesus had told them to wait for the Holy Spirit. Their prayer was a waiting prayer. Many don't find waiting easy. But it is good to pray, waiting for God to speak to us. We may use a psalm, words of a hymn or song or music and give God time to speak to us.

Need

We often omit the waiting and start with need. The Apostles' need was to fill the place left vacant by Judas who had betrayed Jesus and committed suicide.

Scripture

Peter, their spokesman, uses Scripture. He points out that what happened to Judas had been foretold in the Old Testament quoting Psalm 41:9 "Even my bosom friend in whom I trusted who ate my bread has lifted his heel against me". Jesus used that verse on the night before He died. Peter also quoted Psalms 69 and 109:8 "may another seize his position". When faced with a decision it is good to see if Scripture (the Bible) can help us. This may be by our regular reading of the Bible or something we hear in a sermon.

Criteria

Like a 'Person Specification' from an employer looking for an employee, the Apostles had criteria for the replacement. Verses 21-22 show he had to have been with them from the beginning and to have witnessed Jesus' resurrection. They had a short list of two. When faced with a decision we need to consider the options – even writing down 'for' and 'against' may help.

Prayer (2)

"Show us which one you have chosen". They prayed more specifically. Having gone through similar steps to the Apostles with our decision we may pray more specifically about our decision. They cast lots as they waited for the Holy Spirit. We have the Holy Spirit to guide us. Mathias was chosen - they had a Restored Apostle. A decision was made. Following these steps may help us make decisions.
