CAMP ETIQUETTE GUIDELINES

Updated March 8, 2016



Awareness of our appearance is necessary to maintain continuity and give our best visual impression. Remember that we are portraying a person from the 1700 & early 1800's. A list of items that can detract from our character's appearance and some suggestions to help are as follows:

Limit the amount of time your modern vehicle is in camp to one hour, as this is adequate time to unload and load your car, truck, van, etc.

Tennis shoes, sandals or any modern footwear. (Black or brown boots, laced shoes, Chinese slippers or flats can be used.)

Modern sweaters or jackets. (Period jackets, shawls, capes ,etc. can be used)

Noticeable use of makeup, especially eye makeup. (However, sunscreen should be used if needed.)

Modern rings, watches, or outlandish jewelry. (Wedding rings are fine, pocket watches, crosses, cameos, pins, etc., are all fine).

Modern hats, baseball caps, etc. (Hats of should made of straw or felt, sunbonnets, etc.)

Cell phones, cameras, and video cameras, etc. Should be kept under cover when we are in public view. Please step from the main traffic flow when using a cell phone, or better yet leave it in your tent.



Modern sunglasses or plastic eyeglass frames. (If you wear glasses you may consider using contact lenses or having your prescription put into a pair of modern or period metal frames. Sunglasses in metal frames work very well. If these suggestions are not possible for you, please wear your present eyeglasses; we would not want any accidents.)

Gum chewing or cigarette smoking. (Pipes and cigars can be used)

Carrying modern books, purses, backpacks, etc. (Baskets, period purses or canvas haversacks can be used to carry personal items in.)

Carry snacks in a small stuff sack not a plastic bag; (eventually you've got to take it out to take a bite.)

Carry a repro canteen or jug, not a plastic bottle in your haversack or bag, (you've got to pull it out to take a swig)

Leave your child's sneakers at home, let them go barefoot, if you dare, or make an inexpensive pair of moccasins.

Our clothing looks too new. Don't be afraid to get it dirty.

Extreme fingernail length or nail polish. (Gloves can hide that expensive manicure.)

The best advice is – IF IT AIN'T RIGHT, KEEP IT OUT OF SIGHT!
