Messiah Messenger A Pastoral Reflection

Dear Friends in Christ,

Mother Nature is unpredictable, as we all know! And although we can't control Mother Nature, we always hope for those "Goldilocks days" when everything is "just right!" Those days when the wind is light, the sky is clear, the temperature is perfect, and there's enough moisture to keep everything lush and green. Unfortunately, sometimes the combination of heat, wind, and lack of rainfall bring an extended dry spell that stretches into drought. We fret and worry. We watch and wait. We wonder how long it will be until we experience the refreshment of rain!

Abram and Sarai knew a bit about dry spells. In Genesis 12, God spoke to Abram, telling him to go out into the world, far away from home and kinfolk. God told Abram "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, so that you will be a blessing." To Abram and Sarai, God's promise of descendants and a land to call their own must have made everything seem "just right!"

To fulfill the promise, God brought Abram and Sarai out from Ur to Haran, a distance of 650 miles. Then God called them out an additional 400 miles until they finally reached the Promised Land. Between these places lay vast miles of desert and years of tiring travel by foot in a dry and dusty land! There must have been plenty of times Abram and Sarai strained and waited to hear God's voice in the wilderness. In these desert years, you can imagine them feeling as dry and lifeless as the arid landscape around them.

We all experience stretches of time in life when our faith feels dry and we strain to hear God's voice as our feet plod along through a dusty wilderness. Whether due to sadness, doubt, or boredom, dry spells often come upon us gradually, until we wake up one day and feel as if we are in a desert. We long to hear God's promises of blessing, of new life, of rest and renewal where everything seems "just right."

In times like these, we need to remember what Scripture tells us: that we walk with a faithful God who is able to make springs break out in desert places!

Isaiah 41:17-18

That's good news we all can use! In June, our sermon series shared ways we can become "Disciples in Action." We spoke of the importance of seeking after and listening for God's voice. We spoke of the value of practicing God's presence in prayer. During the month of July, we thought we'd offer everyone an opportunity to do just that!

Included in this month's newsletter is a scripture journaling exercise that we suggest using on the four chapters of Philippians. The journaling exercise is called **S.O.A.P.** and it follows the pattern of reading <u>S</u>cripture, writing <u>O</u>bservations, <u>Applying</u> what you've read, and <u>Praying</u> for God's guidance. We advise breaking each chapter into 2 or 3 smaller sections. Then use the **S.O.A.P.** method of journaling to reflect on what God's Spirit may be guiding you to consider in daily living.

As you journey through Philippians, we pray that our gracious and surprising God would renew your faith with refreshing new vision and vitality!
