**Kind:** Happy Monday! This week's theme will be The Three Little Pigs. We will focus on characters and retelling the story. Our vocabulary words this week are fortune, bundle, huffed, and blaze. During phonics we will review /s/, /a/, /t/, /p/, /i/, /n/, and /c k/. We will introduce /e/ and /h/. We will also introduce new sight words to those who are ready. Please practice these nightly, as they are high-frequency words that your student will run into often while reading. Have a great week! - **Mrs. Stewart**

**1st/2nd:** We are back to a full week again! We are gladly welcoming October in 1st and 2nd grade! In 1st grade we are reading the story <u>Stellaluna</u> by Janell Canon. We will talk about main characters, setting, and sequence of events in a story. This is a great story to start off the month of October. We have been talking about doubling the consonants when using a short vowel and we will also be learning how to make words plural. In math we will continue working on doubles facts and becoming more independent in our work. In 2nd grade we are reading the story, <u>I Need My Monster</u>, by Amanda Noll. We will work on sequence of events in a story as well as common and proper nouns. Remember you can always talk about the stories you are reading together in the evenings (ask your students questions like: What was the conflict in the story, who was the main character, what was the setting, what happened first, next, last?) This helps build understanding and connections when they are reading. In math we are continuing to work on identifying even and odd

numbers and addition facts. We will also introduce the thermometer and reading it to the nearest 10 degrees. We are always working on telling time so that is something you can also work on at home. This week 2nd grade starts cursive!

**3rd/4th:** Last week, our class completed our Stanford testing. Those tests will be sent off to be scored. Today, our class completed Star testing. This test assesses each students' reading level based on their performance on the test. It is important that students read every night. The intent behind this is to increase their exposure which will in turn help boost their reading levels. October is the first month that our class will start working on the Book-It Program. In order to receive a free personal pan pizza coupon, each student must read 10 books each month. Chapter books count as 2 books. A reading log should go home today. Students are required to keep track of their reading. Our first AR goals are due this month as well. Fourth grade will have a science test this week on Friday. This week in spelling is a review week for our class. Third grade will be tested over 35 words and fourth grade will be tested over 50. Students have had all of these words on prior spelling lists. - **Mrs. Cooper** 

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students are looking at ways to compare fractions, looking at the associative property, and learning about identifying the factors of various numbers. In sixth grade, students are looking at using diagrams to solve story problems, learning about ratios, and operations involving fractions and mixed numbers.

**Tests This Week:** 5th Math: Tuesday, 6th Math: Thursday 7/8: In seventh grade math, students are sharpening their skills with compasses and reviewing prime factorizations. In pre-Algebra, students are working with mean, median, mode and range and answering questions about data displays. In algebra, students are working on multi-step equations and using the distributive property on algebraic expressions. In grammar, our focus will be on vocabulary, and we will begin a unit on verbs. **Tests This Week:** 7/8 Science: Wednesday, 7th Math: Thursday, Pre-Algebra: Wednesday. -**Mr. Ewing**
