was passed raising \$152.00 which will be given to the LMCS nurse to be distributed as needed. A fun evening was enjoyed by all. MERRY CHRISTMAS








United Methodist Women of Faith 2023 BIBLE VERSES



The produce bins at the church were successful again this year.

Date to move to Wesley Hall for the winter will be the 1st Sunday in January.

Thanksgiving Ecumenical Service at Northwood at 7 p.m. on Sunday, November 20th

New Business: Discussion on the electronic piano use and accompanists who will play it. Bobbi will research this and report at the next meeting.


