
CAN ANYONE HELP?


News of the possible opening of church buildings for private prayer has been released but communal worship of any kind is not currently scheduled until at least early July.



For those who walk past and for those who may not be able to walk past at the moment, here is the first of our prayers on the railings around our church buildings. We will post a prayer a day.






