Francine is an exceptional woman and mother, always on track and extremely generous. She successfully reconciled her job and family life, despite the upheavals that our society can bring. Francine hoped to be a grandmother, saying that she would take everything in stride. Yet her joy was contagious when she saw her son's son, her first grandchild!

She was delighted as we all are when we see a

newborn baby who has just opened a new door of life for us! What a miracle, what joy!

In our readings today, we see a very humble family coming to the Temple: Mary, Joseph and the Infant Jesus. They are poor people and their offering of two doves reflects their status. There are also two elderly people who have witnessed many others arrive at the Temple: Simeon, who was waiting for the Messiah, and Anna, who at eighty-four had outlived many of her contemporaries. They both made marvelous statements about this Infant. Simeon joyfully said that he is now ready to die because his eyes have seen salvation. Anna told everyone about the Infant's incredible future.

Today the Gospel reading brings us to the Temple and the presence of the Infant Jesus. We acknowledge that God exists in every child. We also know that every child brings a promise, Jesus' promise exceeds all our ordinary expectations. In every newborn there is a little reflection of Jesus who comes to shake us out of our fatigue and complacencies and revive our hopes.
