Sophia Sunha Lee, Michelle Sunjoo Lee, Vanessa Young, Eliana Felder, Erica Driscoll, Hannah Piston, Natalie Severson, Haley Hoffman, Avery Turley and Dana Schneider performed for the judges on February 12 and March 12, 2011. These students completed the theory tests on February 12 and received excellent written and oral advice about their playing from the judges at both sessions.

At our May 1st meeting and Chapter Recital, each student will be presented with a beautiful certificate of participation signed by the chair of the National Music Education program, William Lovelace, the President of the Pittsburgh Chapter, Gretchen Van Hoesen, and by Delaine Fedson, President of the National American Harp Society. Thank you to our judges, Marina Di Pretoro Lupinacci and Robert Frankenberry, and thank you to Carnegie Mellon for the use of room A-2 and for the use of the concert grand style 23 harp.

Congratulations to...

Dana Schneider for winning the Pittsburgh Concert Society Young Artists competition. Dana received a cash award and was featured in a recital at Kresge Recital Hall of Carnegie Mellon University on February 27, where she performed works by Tournier, Handel, and Debussy. A senior at Seneca Valley High School, Dana will study harp in college this fall.

Sarah Stern, the new Principal Harp of the Orquesta Filarmónica in Santiago de Chile. She will begin her first season with the orchestra in April, where she will play in subscription concerts, operas, and ballets. Sarah has also been invited to return for the fourth year to the Britten Pears Festival in Aldeburgh, England (Britten's home town), to perform Britten's opera *Albert Herring* in October.

Michelle Sunjoo Lee, who won first place in the Three Rivers Young Peoples' Orchestra Concerto Competition. She will be the featured soloist performing the Dittersdorf Concerto with the orchestra under the direction of John Wilcox on May 8, 2011, at 7:00 PM, Carnegie Music Hall, Oakland.

Katie Ventura, who won the harp position in the Pacific Music Festival 2011, which will take place in Sapporo, Japan from July 9 to August 4, 2011. She will perform with the orchestra, attend master classes and tour to Osaka and Tokyo, all expenses paid! Following a competitive audition Katie also won the Associate Position with the Civic Orchestra of Chicago led by Principal Conductor Cliff Colnot. She will begin work with them in the fall of 2011. In addition, she will be performing in Ravel's La Valse and Alborado del Gracioso with the New World Symphony in Miami Beach, FL on April 9 and 10 with conductor Stephane Deneve.

The first courses are available at ARS Musica Conservatory! ARS Musica Conservatory is the online resource for harpists of all levels who want to improve their harp and musicianship skills. You can listen to free podcasts about techniques for improving your practice, your music reading or other "Learning Music From the Inside" skills. There are downloadable, printable "harp-work" homework courses that are three weeks worth of practice on the techniques outlined in the podcasts. Also there are free articles on harp-related topics. SPARX (Joan Sparks and **Anne Sullivan**) flute and harp duo and composer Chuck Holdeman have launched a commissioning project. The duo has commissioned Chuck to write a sonata for them, but the steps of the process and the progress of the piece are being posted on YouTube for others to watch and to comment on. The videos available at this point are of the first movement and a fragment of the second movement. There are also videos that discuss various performance difficulties in the work and questions of balance and length.
