General Around The Town

Whilst the Lifestyle development on Stuart Road goes to VCAT, some may have seen the large display board between the Preschool/Bunguyan Reserve and the United service station. The proposed development, Spindrift, is for some 44 houses within the 20 acres. Whilst walking around I have noticed, and also been asked by a new resident about 'hard rubbish'. On reviewing the Council website, the collection of hard rubbish placed on the nature strip needs to be arranged and booked with the Shire. Details are on their website.

Council Elections

Council elections are confirmed for October 2020. As in the past, voting is compulsory. Remember, to vote you must be enrolled. Enrolment closes on Friday, 28th August. Keep an eye out for announcements of those who will be standing in our Ward of Watson and be diligent in understanding what their platform is and how it may impact our

community.

Unfortunately, due to the lockdown we won't be able to invite the candidates to our October meeting to outline their platforms, so you will need to check out the VEC website to see who is standing & what they are promising.

Due to the current Stage 4 restrictions our AGM which was due to be held in October has been postponed to a date to be advised, hopefully at a December 2020 meeting. COVID-19

Whether you like it or not, as we all should know by now, we are in Stage 4 restrictions. All activities must take place within 5km of your home, unless you have a dispensation. That means the following:

• Curfew between the hours of 8:00pm & 5:00am. That means staying at home unless going to work, for medical care or caregiving. Permits are required.

Plus the modified Stage 3 restrictions of:

- Shopping for food or other essential items. One person once per
- Exercise outside & only with one other person. One hour per day.
- Seeking medical care
- Permitted work under the permitted work scheme.

Additionally, there is a requirement to wear a mask whilst outside. For those who think they are being hard done by, accept the fact & wear a mask; if not for yourself, then for the rest of the population.

We are fortunate here that we don't have the statistics of other locations, but that is always changeable. A side benefit of the restrictions is how quiet the roads and skies have been. More importantly, if you feel unwell or believe you have some of the symptoms, get tested.

Community Info and Support



during Coronavirus

Restrictions are tightened further on the Mornington Peninsula

These are challenging times. Victoria has entered a State of Disaster and Mornington Peninsula has entered Stage 4 restrictions with stronger rules to limit the movement of people.

As we navigate the next six weeks let's do our best to be patient, resilient and calm. This situation is unfamiliar to all of us. We are in this together and if we all do the right thing we will be on the other side of this sooner.

Major changes to our day-to-day lives include:

- Curfew from 8pm-5am every day (the only reasons to leave home during curfew hours are for permitted work, and essential health, care or safety reasons)
- Exercise is limited to a maximum of one hour per day and no more than five kilometres from your home. Group size is limited to a maximum of two*
- Shopping is limited to one person per household per day and within five kilometres of your home*
- Students (including year 11 and 12) learning from home from Wednesday 5 August
- From Thursday 6 August kindergartens, family day care and early childhood education services are only open to vulnerable children and children whose parents are permitted workers
- The Night Network (route 970 to Rosebud) is suspended
- Face masks/coverings continue to be mandatory.

There are only four reasons to leave your home between 5am – 8pm:



Groceries and essential items within 5km



Care and caregiving



Exercise within 5km



Permitted work and study only

^{*} If you are unable to leave home because it would mean leaving a young child or at-risk person alone then they can accompany you. If your closest supermarket is further than five kilometres, you can still shop there.

Changes to Shire services

- Tips and hoppers (open for commercial use only. The 2019/20 waste voucher expiry date will be extended until 31 December 2020)

- · Boat ramps (only commercial fishing can continue)

- · Community halls and houses
- · Mornington Peninsula Regional Gallery
- · Our Library
- · Recreation centres and pool.

Open for people who live within 5km:

- · The Briars is open to pedestrians (closed to visitor vehicles)
- Beaches
- Cemeteries
- · Sporting fields (for personal exercise only).

Modified services:

- Customer Service (phone and online only)
- Aged and Disability Care
- Maternal and Child Health and Immunisation
- Family Day Care
- Youth Services
- Animal Shelter.

Online resources and activities:

- Belgravia Leisure, which runs Mornington Peninsula Shire's aquatic and recreation centres, is looking out for our community in a generous way while gyms are closed, by offering Peninsula residents free access to its online fitness and nutrition portal during lockdown.
- Mornington Peninsula Regional Gallery is continuing to deliver free online arts
 and crafts workshops for young and old. They also offer insightful interviews with
 artists on MPRGTV and podcasts.
- Our Library hosts free Zoom events, including author talks and LEGO challenges.
 Join children's Storytime Tuesdays 3pm and Thursday 11am and Babytime on Fridays 11am live on their Facebook page.

Worker support payment

If you have tested positive to COVID-19 or are awaiting your test results, you must stay at home. The only permitted reason to leave your home is to receive urgent medical care. The Department of Health and Human Services can provide financial support to Victorian workers who are self-isolating or quarantining because they are waiting for test results, have been diagnosed with COVID-19 or are a close contact of a confirmed case.

Local testing clinics

If you have any symptoms, however mild, you should get tested. Symptoms can include: fever, coughing, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, headache, muscle or joint pains, nausea, diarrhoea, vomiting, loss of sense of smell, altered sense of taste, loss of appetite and fatigue.

For further advice call the 24-hour Coronavirus hotline 1800 675 398, your general practitioner or use the State Government's online self-assessment tool.

Testing is free if done through a public health facility or GP offering bulk billing.

Rosebud Hospital: The clinic is located in Eleanora House at the front of the Rosebud Hospital site and is open daily 10am-6pm.

Frankston Hospital: Open daily from 10am-6pm at 12 Hastings Road, Frankston.

Drive Through Screening Clinic: Monash University Peninsula Campus, Moorooduc Highway, Frankston. Open daily 8.30am-4pm.

Atticus Health Medical Clinic Hastings: Testing at the clinic car park. Tests are by appointment only.

Rosebud Respiratory Clinic at the Rosebud Skin Cancer Centre: Testing at the clinic by appointment.

Have Your Say

Blacks Camp Road, Somerville

Mornington Peninsula Shire invites the community to share their feedback and help Council decide on a new name for Blacks Camp Bushland Reserve, road and local pre-school in Somerville.

Community feedback has indicated the name 'Blacks Camp' is a derogatory term that is inappropriate and offensive to the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community.

Renaming the road, pre-school and reserve is an opportunity to pay respect to First Nations people by selecting a name that builds recognition of the Shire's rich cultural history and provides a platform for further community education.

Council has shortlisted names in partnership with the Bunurong Land Council which recognise the important cultural history of the site.

- Beek Beak pronounced "Biik Biik", meaning earth (many lands)
- Burinyong Balug pronounced "Burinyong Balook", Burinyong meaning Bunurong, Balook meaning mob, people, group or clan.
- Mayone Balug pronounced "Moi on Balook", meaning Bunurong Clan - the area at the top of the Mornington Peninsula and the head of Westernport Bay
- Ngooraak pronounced "Nugrook", meaning mountain.
