ENTRANCE/ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

(Programs of four hundred fifty (450) or more clock hours or the credit hour equivalent shall administer a basic skills examination to each student who enrolls, unless the student has provided evidence of a high school graduation diploma, general equivalency diploma, or its equivalent.)

Students must be at least (16) sixteen years of age and have proof of education or pass the (TABE) Test of Adult Basic Education with a minimum score of 70% on all sections to enroll at UR Beauty & Barber Academy. Student having a high school diploma or GED do not have to take the (TABE) Test of Adult Basic Education. Students may enroll at any time. The attendance clock hours, assignments, and exam scores will determine completion of the program. Students under the age of (18) eighteen are required to bring a legal guardian to fill out admission documents.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the Restricted Barbering program is to teach and prepare students for the state examination. After completing the necessary clock hours and services, the students will receive the diploma and will be registered to take the state exam to become a licensed Restricted Barber and enter the workforce in an entry level position.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:

The Restricted Barbering program is designed to train students in area of cutting, shaving facial, and hair modification. Hair modifications include but are not limited to washing, cutting, styling, and blow-drying. Other topics to be covered in this program include communication skills, human relations, infection controls, HIV/AIDS, and business ethics. Registration for licensure in the State of Florida will be sent after completion of clock hours and services

EMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE:

While UR Beauty & Barber Academy cannot guarantee employment for graduates, assistance in finding employment is provided by posting area job openings on a career opportunities bulletin board for students to review. Students also receive training in professionalism and job search skills including how to write a resume, complete an employment application, and prepare for an effective interview. The curriculum places a great deal of emphasis with the school on current employments or employment needs. In addition, the school maintains a network of relationships with professionals and employers who provide monitoring to students while they are in school. Job referrals are made known to interested graduates as available.

GRADING PROCEDURES:

Students are regularly given written and practical exams throughout the duration of the program. The minimum passing grade for this program is "C". All academic records are confidential and permanently archived at the school. UR Beauty & Barber Academy grading scales is as follows:

TEACHING METHODS:

UR Beauty & Barber Academy utilizes a variety of teaching methods.
