Camp Excel

Camp Excel is an alternative summer day camp for youth considered to be at risk for substance abuse. Camp is held Mondays, Wednesdays, & Fridays at Montgomery Hall Park in Staunton. Camp begins mid June and runs through the first week of August. Campers enjoy swimming, arts & crafts, sports, and learning new skills throughout summer. Lunch, snacks, and supplies are provided. There is a \$20 fee, which also covers the required camp T-shirt. VCSB provides limited transportation options in Staunton, Waynesboro, and Augusta County. Space is limited to 30 youth ages 8-12, and 15 mentors ages 13-17. Applications are available through VCSB.
