The Problem

•They are not seeking God anymore •See Jeremiah 22:1-9

•The rulers are not ruling with the justice, wisdom, and righteousness of God

•Both rulers and people have "gone deep into depravity"

The Problem

- •They have become a snare and a net •Words used for hunters, not shepherds
- •All Israel have become hunters they are destroying one another for the sake of personal gain.
- •See Ps. 119:110; 140:5

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The Problem

Tabor and Mizpah

Places of assembly for religious purposes
Tabor – north
Mizpah - south

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The Depravity of Israel -3-7

- $\cdot {\rm God}$ knows what they are doing it is not hidden from Him
- •They do not know God, but He knows them!
- •No hide and seek with God

The Depravity of Israel – 3-7

•Turned to prostitution – physically and spiritually NOTE!

Israel is successful on the outside but on the inside they are falling apart

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The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•Their deeds do not permit them to turn to God

•Turned away from God to false spirits

•Rejected God as the only one and true God

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The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•There is no one to call them to repentance

- •There is no one who believes that repentance is needed
- •They do not recognize sin as sin
- •Truth has become what they decide it is

The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•They are arrogant before God

- •They do not consider God as the utmost of importance
- •As a result, they stumble along in sin they are no longer on the path of God

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The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•They are pretending to worship God

•Go out with a display or show of worship

•This is not a real worship of God, it is all a show of religion

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The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•Question: How do we know that it was false worship?

The Depravity of Israel -3-7

•Answer: Their actions between times of worship

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The Depravity of Israel - 8-12

•Blow the Horn •Perhaps a trumpet call to war •Syro-Ephraimite war? •2 Kings 16:5-10

•Gibeon, Ramah, Beth-Aven – towns on the border of North and South Israel

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The Depravity of Israel -8-12

•God promises destruction

•A day of reckoning from God for breaking the Covenant

•The leaders practice deceit

The Depravity of Israel- 13-15

Israel made a covenant with Assyria
They sought salvation/help from man rather than God
King Menahem - 745-737 - 2 Kings 15:19-20
King Hoshea - 732 - 2 Kings 17:1-6

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The Depravity of Israel- 13-15

- •God promises exile based upon the Sinai Covenant
- •God is clearly against them as He shows Himself as a lion against Israel

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The Depth of God's Grace – 6:1-3

 $\ensuremath{\cdot}\ensuremath{\mathrm{God}}$ offers to bring them back

•It is up to Israel to ask and seek after God
