
New Storm Windows

Priest: God added his testimony by signs, wonders, various acts of power, and distribution of the gifts of the Holy Spirit according to His will.

All: I will offer praise in the great assembly; my vows I will fulfill before those who fear Him.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11

ALLELUIA (John 8:12b)

Priest: Alleluia, alleluia. All: Alleluia, alleluia.

Priest: I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will not walk in

darkness, but will have the light of life.

All: Alleluia, alleluia.

GOSPEL: John 2:1-12

Priest: A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. John

All: Glory be to You, Lord!

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish

ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told the them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.


Priest: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Reflection Questions:

1. Surprisingly, when his own mother said, "They have no wine." Jesus replied, "How does your concern affect me?" Wasn't this a rude answer? Why did he say it? In spite of his response, Mary trusted that he would somehow solve the problem. If this trust rates a 10, where would you put your trust when you go to God with your concerns?

2. This Sunday, together with the previous two (i.e., Epiphany, the Lord's Baptism, and now the miracle at Cana), prepare for Jesus' public ministry (he denies that it has begun yet in today's reading). Compare and contrast these three events.
