
Architecturally striking in its sophisticated modern design, Tridel's Islington Terrace is located right in the heart of Islington City Centre.

- **Downtown in 20!** Get downtown within 20 minutes from Islington station at Bloor Subway.

- **Connected.** MiExpress buses to Mississauga provide direct service to University of Toronto's Mississauga Campus and the Square One Shopping Centre. TTC buses service routes throughout Etobicoke.

- **Access to Pearson.** Pearson International Airport is accessible with all-day express bus service, just one subway stop away.

- **The Better Way.** During the week, subway service begins at 6:00 am and ends at 1:30 am. On Sunday service starts at 9:00 am and ends at 1:30 am. Trains run every 2-3 minutes during rush hour and every 4-5 minutes outside of rush hour.

- **Safety and Convenience.** DWA's (Designated Waiting Areas) located on the subway station platform offer brighter lights, intercom service, closed-circuit television camera and a public telephone - all for your safety at night.

- **Park & Go.** There is commuter parking at the station available from 5:00 am to 2:00 am for a nominal charge.

- **Grab a Cab.** A Taxi station located within the bus terminal





2011 Population By Age Group



AREA OFFICE BUILDINGS

Sun Life Financial Towers Centre – 3250-3300 Bloor Street West

Sun Life Financial Centre is located in the heart of Islington City Centre at the corner of the Islington Avenue and Bloor Street. This prime location has direct access to Islington Station at Bloor Subway. The complex’s retail space services an office population of over 4,000 as well as an additional 500 office workers and 1,000 residential units from the adjoining properties. All this combined with a recently completed \$1.2 million food court renovation; makes Sun Life Financial Centre the number one business address in Etobicoke.

Islington Professional Healthcare Centre – 1243 Islington Ave

On the northeast corner of Islington and Aberfoyle, just steps away from Bloor & Islington. This building is located minutes from the Islington Station at Bloor Subway. Short travel time to Bloor/Yonge station, Union Station, Toronto Pearson International Airport, and Mimico Go Station.

56 Aberfoyle Crescent

Located at the north-east corner of Bloor & Islington. This office is serviced by the Islington Station at Bloor Subway, Toronto TTC and Mississauga Public Transit.



FUTURE DEVELOPMENT IN AREA

Over \$100 million in new construction and improvements

- **\$53 million** will be spent to completely redesign and reconstruct the TTC Islington Station bus terminal for easier access. This will also provide greater flexibility for bus operations at the station.
- This TTC-only bus terminal work will occur concurrently with the development of the Kipling Regional Bus Terminal design. The existing slotted-style bus terminal will be reconfigured to a fully-accessible island-style facility, which would be located in the north-east corner of the Islington Station lands
- City of Toronto's 10-year Capital Plan also includes \$42 million for redeveloping Six Points Interchange and access to Kipling Subway Station.
- \$8 million to be spent in redeveloping the TTC Kipling Station Interregional Bus Terminal
- City of Toronto plans to spend \$251,900 to improve Tom Riley Park North Tennis Courts under Recreational Infrastructure Canada and the Ontario REC programs.

Additional development plans in the area include:

- Islington Village Business Improvement Area (BIA) improvements
- Streetscape Improvement Plans include a proposal to upgrade the streetscape along Dundas Street West, east of Kipling.
- Mabelle Arts – Plans to create a “A Park of Many Paths” revolving around transforming Mabelle Park through the action of local residents, artists and a number of other organizations.
- Ongoing Development and Infrastructure Improvements – includes upgrading work on the conditions of the Bloor Street Underpass, currently underway.


