Trevor's Column

Dear sisters and brothers,

Ash Wednesday marked the beginning of Lent, which is the period of the church liturgical year leading up to Easter. It was designed to prepare believers through prayer, penitence, almsgiving and self denial for the annual celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Historically it was originally an intense period of fasting and prayer for those preparing for baptism at the Easter. By the Council of Nicaea in 325AD it had become a 40-day requirement for the spiritual benefit of all Christians to show solidarity baptismal candidates.

It is a season of reflection and preparation, a time to go back to spiritual essentials. It could be regarded as a season of spiritual 'spring cleaning'; a time for taking a personal inventory, and then cleaning out those things which hinder our relationships with Jesus and our service to him. There are a number of Lenten disciplines we might choose to observe as we seek to become more like Christ. I will mention just four.

In current Western societies the practice of *fasting* is considerably more relaxed than it used to be. Moreover, in our Protestant tradition it is a choice rather than an obligation. But in "giving something up" for Lent, we embrace an excellent spiritual discipline. Some might deliberately choose to give up sins to confront an evil habit (e.g. gossip). Others might abstain from things for which they have an inordinate desire (e.g. chocolate, alcohol). By giving these things up, the person fasting learns with God's help to control a particular part of their life, which ideally leads to greater self-control the remainder of the year.

This season is a good time to develop or strengthen *daily prayer*. A good goal might be to pray the Daily Prayer Services from our Prayer Book during the week, as well as attending public worship every Sunday. Contemplative prayer, based around the idea of utilising silence or listening for God, may also be suitable for some. While Lent may involve 'giving something up', it is also about putting something positive in its place. The best way to remove vice is to cultivate virtue. As a result, it has been traditionally a time for *charity*, for helping the poor or doing acts of charity and mercy. While this should be a year round calling, this season is a good time to intentionally focus on this.

When facing temptation in the desert, Jesus relied on Scripture to counter the wiles of the devil. It is a formidable weapon for us as well. Biblical illiteracy among Anglican Christians is regrettably rampant, so this is an excellent time to remedy this problem by establishing a daily pattern for *Bible reading* to let the word of Christ dwell in us richly.

Finally, whatever we choose to do to prepare for Easter, it is crucial we heed the command of Jesus that we do not do it to seek the praise of others but secretly longing only for God's commendation.
