HELLO'S AND GOODBYE'S

You remember this rather famous list of "seasons" from Ecclesiastes 3.1-8, I'm sure... "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace."

One contrasting pair of "seasons" which this famous passage does <u>not</u> directly address is a time for hello's and a time for goodbye's. I suppose you could say such times are alluded to in other ways in this ancient writing...but considering how <u>basic</u> they are to human life, it's surprise to me that they not directly mentioned! Here at St. Paul UCC, we are directly <u>living through</u> a time of goodbye's this summer, saying "farewell and God bless" in retirement to our former Nursery School Director, Karen Rieman and one of our long-time teachers, Sue Ehrhardt (and a teacher's aide, Amy Miller). We have also said goodbye—at least for the foreseeable future it seems—to any sense of normalcy in our social lives in general, and our church's congregational life in particular, due to the ongoing Covid -19 pandemic.

But, as it is with all those contrasting pairs in Ecclesiastes, the goodbyes come with some new hello's, and the opportunity to welcome even more. We say an enthusiastic "HELLO!" to a new Nursery School Director, Judy Staudigel (who was a teacher here at one time), and "HELLO!" to a new pathway and sense of enthusiasm in the Nursery School. Judy is already at work with the teachers, updating things, contacting parents, and planning to reopen the school in September. And the teachers—who do not get paid in the summer months—are already at work too! It's very inspiring to see!

And with that kind of inspiration in view, we can expect that there are <u>other</u> opportunities for a big "HELLO!"...e.g., to summon a deep and intentional <u>welcoming of HOPE and TRUST in God</u> in the very midst of this pandemic and its effects on us as a culture, a church, and as individuals. Will there be a "new normal" someday (or, are we in it already)? Have we said goodbye forever to life as we once knew it? Who knows for sure? But...in the long run, it doesn't really matter!

Because with each goodbye comes the new HELLO. And as people of faith, we should not only know this, but **practice** it! People of strong, mature faith know that, even in the midst of pain and confusion, the goodbyes must be welcomed, even embraced. We have survived goodbyes in the past, including some really tough ones, and there will undoubtedly be more. Plus, we can also see, when we purposefully, prayerfully turn our eyes toward (and fully grasp) the biblical stories of

our faith, that God is GREAT at new hellos!...and has been from the very beginning. Literally! God created the cosmos out of NOTHING. So who better—and who else??—to trust in this time when <u>nothing</u> seems the same, when <u>nothing</u> feels quite right, when <u>nothing</u> seems to work very well...and we get overwhelmed to the point sometimes where we may feel <u>nothing</u>! Remember: "**nothing**" is the stuff with God does some of the most amazing, awe-inspiring, world-shaping work...but it takes the eyes of faith and deep, radical trust and cooperation with God to see and to welcome the big HELLO, and to make it real in the everyday world for others to see and embrace. So...HELLO! Let's work at making this chaotic time a season of huge HELLO'S for St. Paul UCC...let's be disciples in whom God does some really amazing, awe-inspiring, even world-shaping work!
