

From Fr. Francisco 's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

We are already on the third Sunday of Lent. In Year C, we find the Gospel that speaks about the fig tree that for three years did not give fruit. This word about fruits is extremely important. A few weeks ago the readings also spoke about fruits. That time I said that fruits are the way we live our Christianity — how we answer to others, how we treat others, how we love others. The difference between this word and that word a few weeks ago is that in this word, we know that there are no fruits. The fact of not having fruits is not into question, on the contrary, it is affirmed that there are no fruits and for three years. A few weeks ago it was a call to discern if we had fruits. This



time the Gospel is clearly telling us that we have no fruits and is saying that the Church/Jesus in the figure of the gardener is telling God to give us some more time to convert. And that the gardener will work the soil around us to help us give fruits. Thus, if you feel that during this time of Lent God is removing and shifting things in your life, it is Jesus who is moving and removing the soil around you so that you may produce fruit.

On Monday we will have our Bible Study at 7 PM in Mother Angela. Also, Monday is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord so please see the Mass Schedule. On Thursday, the Cardinal is having the third prayer service for victims of sexual abuse. We are cancelling mass and Stations of the Cross in Portuguese and Spanish in the evening, and we are all invited to attend at the Cathedral. It is very important to be part of this healing process.
