Preschool: I can't believe we made it to March! The weather is beginning to transition into spring. Please, make sure your child has a jacket, hat and gloves. Kind: This week my class will be reviewing the "-ing" family. We will be going over the sound and how it changes a word by placing it at the end. We will also continue to work on reading and answering several questions over stories we have read. In math we will be reviewing coins we have already learned and I will be introducing Quarters to the students. I will also be working with students on their counting. Please, work on this at home as well. The goal is for students to be able to count to 100 by 1's and 10's without any help. Let's have another great week! ******************************

1st/2nd: 1st and 2nd grade had an amazing week last week. This week we will continue working hard. First grade will begin a science unit on habitats. We will also be working on more math facts, including two digit numbers, as well as working on our Phonics and Reading Comprehensive Strategies. Students will have new sight word flash cards to practice. Second grade will be adding quarters to their money counting skills this week. They will have a reading test over Ugly Vegetables on Tuesday. We will begin a new unit in Social Studies, discussing who helped discover and found America. In both classes, we will continue observing our tomato plants, and journaling those observations. Remember AR tests are due soon. Students are given time in class to read, however they need to be reading at home too. *******************************

3rd/4th: Our class has been busy little bees that have been just working away. This week in Language Arts, we will be focusing on subject/verb agreement. 3rd grade will have a math test on Tuesday and 4th grade will have one on Friday. Both classes will have science tests on Tuesday as well. Science study guides should have come home last week to be studying. We are still practicing for the MAP test as well. It has become part of our daily routine. *******************************

5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders will continue looking at different types of poetry in Writing this week. In Science, 5th graders will have a test over Ch. 8 on Friday and 6th grade will be reading Ch. 3 about "Color and Light". In English, both grades will continue looking at adverbs and prepositions and in Reading, students will work through their Buckledown and C.A.R.S. workbooks. In Social Studies, 5th graders will start a new chapter over the Civil War and will also have a Label Europe test on Wed. 6th graders will read about communication and religion in Ancient Mesopotamia.

Reminder: 5th-8th graders need to pass 1 AR book by Mon. March 8th and turn in a reading log with the test. 7th/8th Grade Comm. Arts: Students will continue working through Buckledown and C.A.R.S. workbooks and will finish
