'Trevor's Frank's Column'

Dear sisters and brothers,

Interpreting Revelation

Last week we focused on the Letters of Jesus to the Seven Churches, as these are the focus of our present preaching series. However, as some are keen to gain a perspective on the whole book, here are a few pointers, which I'll present over this week and next.

How should we understand this book? It has been the playground of cranks ever since it was written—and still is. Is there any way of assuring ourselves that we are reading the book in the way John intended?

There are essentially four approaches to the interpretation of this book. All efforts to unravel its meaning employ one of these approaches, or attempt to combine two or more. We will describe and assess them in turn, particularly in the light of the way in which John introduces his writing in the first chapter. John describes his work in the very first verse: "The revelation of Jesus Christ, which God gave him to show his servants what must soon take place" (1:1). But we must ask, "Which servants?" and "What future is being revealed?"

- -The *preterist* approach emphasizes the meaning of Revelation for its first readers, and questions any interpretation which does not keep them firmly in mind. They are the "servants" who will experience "what must soon take place."
- The *historicist* approach, on the other hand, views Revelation as a kind of almanac to world history, written in advance. This is the approach by which some, for instance, have identified the Pope as "the beast," or have found the European Community signified in the beast's ten horns (13:1).
- The *futurist* approach interprets "what must soon take place" even more radically. It maintains that Revelation is concerned only with the events of the End, the very last events in world history, including the coming of Christ and the final judgment.

Very differently, the timeless-symbolic approach treats the book as a series of parables. What is important, this approach maintains, is the timeless truth conveyed by the powerful images of the book—images such as "the Lamb" and "the heavenly Jerusalem."

How are we to assess these rival approaches? In all probability they are not as mutually exclusive as they seem.

This may seem tantalizing, but hopefully the picture will become clearer next week, when we will be looking at a way of understanding the big patterns in the book of Revelation in a way which will help us to grasp the main message(s) of this wonderful and encouraging work.

I know about the slander of those who say they are Jews and are not, but are a synagogue of Satan. ¹⁰ Do not be afraid of what you are about to suffer. I tell you, the devil will put some of you in prison to test you, and you will suffer persecution for ten days. Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you life as your victor's crown.
