# Religion is good for your health!

I read during the week: Another book about religion and mental health "The Awakened Brain", or The Psychology of Spirituality and Our Search
for Meaning". It's by a psychologist who has spent years working on the
association between the two. Lisa Miller - the author - tells that in 2012
she and her team at Columbia University first looked at MRI scans from
patients with a high and low genetic risk of depression - because this, like
so much else has a hereditary component. But respondents were also
asked whether religion and spirituality were important to them.

The results made the sceptical team fall silent: "The high-spiritual brain was healthier and more robust than the non-spiritual brain. And the high-spiritual brain was thicker and stronger in exactly the same regions that weaken and wither in depressed brains."

Dr Patricia Casey of UCD has done work not just on the association between spirituality and mental health but on the far more interesting question of religion and mental health - so, on the link between active religious observance (such as going to Mass) and better outcomes when it comes to depression. And it's not simply what you'd expect from any social activity (choir, book club, knitting group).

Actively religious people have better mental health than secular people. The article, by Melanie McDonagh in The Tablet, obviously expands on that idea - this is just the introduction but I thought Id' share it with you.

Also as I write this we're in the middle of the week when we were due to have Confirmation: once again, our Confirmation candidates and their families are in our thoughts and prayers.
