Dear Parishioners,

You might have heard that the bishop has extended the dispensation from the Mass for all who are immune-compromised until November 23. Those who are able to come to Mass are encouraged to do so. We continue to offer several options for returning to Mass. You can register online, by telephone or if you attend the same Mass you can sign up to be automatically registered. Lastly, you can register at the door if seating is available. I know some have commented that when they went to register online, they couldn't because the list was already full. We have set the number of online registrations to 75 people, this will allow more people to register. If you find that you cannot register for your preferred Mass, please call the parish office. Normally we have some seating available for everyone who comes while still keeping within the bishop's directives and keeping everyone safe. We can seat up to 100 people including the musicians, ushers, sacristans, lectors and myself. We will continue to require masks and practice social distancing. Normally, we range between the mid 80's to the mid 50's, so there is still plenty of room for those who wish to return. If you have any questions, please call the office.
