AGM

Even though the majority of children are not back to school yet, the 40km limit is still in place on school days. Year 12 and some year 11 students have already returned to school and the next step is that Preps, grade 1&2 students will return on Monday, 18th October for two days a week. This will mean an increase in the number of cars around the schools. Hopefully the children will enjoy being back with their friends to finish off their school year.

COVID-19

We are fully aware of this insidious pandemic and what it has done to our lives, but I would urge everyone to get vaccinated. The sooner we

reach the target percentages the sooner we get out of lockdown.

Our community is great at rolling up their sleeves and getting the jab. This week Mornington Peninsula reached an important milestone: 80 per cent have had their first dose and nearly 60 per cent have had two doses of the COVID-19 vaccine.

Later in this newsletter you will find the current restrictions in place on the Mornington Peninsula. According to the Victorian government 'roadmap' by the end of this month if 70% of the population is fully vaccinated the 9:00pm curfew will be lifted, 10 fully vaccinated people will be able to gather outdoors and community sport training will return. Pubs, clubs and entertainment venues will open to 50 fully vaccinated people, but only outdoors. Funerals and weddings will again be able to be held, but again only for 50 fully vaccinated people outdoors. All school students will return to school and hairdressers and personal care venues will be open to fully vaccinated people.

As you can see there is a theme running through these plans: fully vaccinated will allow you to take part in these activities. Talk to your GP if you are unsure.

COVID-19 updates, latest news and information

The following restrictions are currently in place across Metropolitan Melbourne, including the Mornington Peninsula.

Curfew from 9pm to 5am - a person is not permitted to leave their home except for limited reasons.

Stay at home unless:

- shopping for necessary goods and services (one person per household, once per day, a support person can accompany if required)
- · caregiving or compassionate reasons
- · authorised work or permitted education, or work interstate
- socialize or exercise (up to four hours, with one other person plus dependants if they cannot be left unattended. The other person can be from another household).
 Up to five people may gather from two households may socialize or exercise if everyone over age of 18 have had two vaccination doses.
- receive a COVID-19 vaccination
- · other specified reasons (specific exemptions apply)

Face coverings:

- · must be carried at all times
- must be worn indoors and outdoors by Victorians aged 12 years or over except if at home, or when visiting an intimate partner's place of residence or if an exception applies
- · recommend primary school age children wear masks indoors and outdoors, except at home or if an exception applies
- · exception for food and drink limited so that face coverings can only be removed to eat and to drink non-alcoholic beverages

Regularly check the exposure sites listing

Changes to Shire services

Continuing as normal:

- · Rubbish, recycling and green waste bins collection
- · Maternal and child health and immunisation appointments
- · Meals on Wheels (delivered to the home only)
- · Personal care
- · Kindergartens
- · Animal shelter (appointments preferred).

Closed to the public:

- · Resource Recovery Centres (open to commercial use only card payments only and permits must be shown)
- · Hoppers
- · Community Halls and Houses
- Mornington Peninsula Regional Gallery
- · Visitors Centre at the Briars
- · Recreation centres and pools
- Boat ramps

Open for people who live within 15km:

- · The Briars, including the Wildlife Sanctuary
- Beaches
- · Playgrounds
- Skateparks
- · Sporting fields (for personal exercise only)
- Mount Martha Public Golf Course

The uncertainty the pandemic brings can affect our mental health and we might feel stressed, anxious and worried in ways we haven't before.

If you live under threat of family violence by another person in your home and you are at risk, you are allowed to leave home. Local testing clinics

If you have any symptoms, however mild, you should get tested. Symptoms can include: fever, coughing, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, headache, loss of sense of smell, altered sense of taste, loss of appetite and fatigue.

For further advice call the 24-hour Coronavirus hotline 1800 675 398, your general practitioner or use the State Government's online self-assessment tool.

Testing is free if done through a public health facility or GP offering bulk billing.

Rosebud Hospital: The clinic is located in Eleanora House at the front of the Rosebud Hospital.

Frankston Hospital: Corner of Hastings Road and Yuillie Street, Frankston.

Atticus Health Medical Clinic Hastings: Testing at the clinic car park. Tests are by appointment only.

Rosebud Respiratory Clinic at the Rosebud Skin Cancer Centre: Testing at the clinic by appointment.
