

Following the Prayer after Communion, all kneel as the Priest incenses the Blessed Sacrament on the altar.


The Blessed Sacrament is carried in procession to the Parish Hall.

The Priest and Deacons go to the altar in silence and, after making a reverence to the altar, prostrate themselves.


The faithful KNEEL and pray silently until the Priest and Deacons stand.

We thrice respond:




† Please KNEEL briefly after each response.



THE BLESSING OF THE FIRE AND PREPARATION OF THE CANDLE

The Easter Fire was kindled after Morning Prayer, and has continued to burn patiently until this solemn moment. All of the lights in the church are off, and the community turns to view the blessing of the new fire.

The Priest lights the paschal candle from the new fire, saying:

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds.


Altar servers and ministers light the candles of the faithful.

After the Proclamation is over, please extinguish your candle and BE SEATED.






