PRAYERS NEEDED


Heavenly Father, we're praying for those in need of Your healing touch for their hurting hearts.

3. Fill the shoebox with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child this Christmas. Our opening hours are Monday - Friday, 9.00-18.00 & Saturday 10.00-16.00.

But one moment I do remember quite clearly. I was looking at all of you when all of a sudden, I was that little boy again, performing on my back porch. I was in Liverpool, and I was receiving the biggest musical hug I had ever gotten. I almost cried right then and there, in front of you.

St. James, you have touched my heart. Many friendships have been made with you and I treasure them all. You have moulded a part of me and had such an impact.... I tell everyone about the wonderful people of St. James! You are all so very, very special. I can never repay what you have given me.

When the Covid plague has passed and it is safe, we will return. And we so look forward to being with you. You are wonderful, radical people! **SHINE ON**!



1 Thessalonians 5:1-11 New International Version - The day of the Lord

5 Now, brothers and sisters, about times and dates we do not need to write to you, ² for you know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. ³ While people are saying, 'Peace and safety', destruction will come on them suddenly, as labour pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape. 4 But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness so that this day should surprise you like a thief. 5 You are all children of the light and children of the day.
