Black River keel boat float from Davidsonville State Park to Jacksonport State Park.

These three events are in the water and thus, we need a crew. Let me know if you can attend any or all. Plans are to float the Black River, in northeastern Arkansas, beginning on Tuesday December 27th from Davidsonville State Park and ending on Friday December 30th at Jacksonport State Park. December 26th is a travel day to Davindsonville SP. The trip is about 80 miles. So far the crew is Tim and I, so, let me know if you are even considering going. There are two opportunities for a day only trip, the first and last day. On the first day you can crew from Davidsonville SP to Powhatan SP and the second would be near where Hwy 37 crosses the river, floating to Jacksonport. Additionally there could be some one or two days floats, that would require an overnight. Let me know if you can go one to four days.

Some comments for crew:

- 1. There is a cost of food, which is roughly \$30 per person.
- 2. Two storage bags, first, Bring a modern sleeping bag and pad, we are taking no chances on frostbite, and second, a bag for your gear, extra

clothes, etc. What works well is either a sea bag or a  ${\tt G.I.}$  Duffle bag for

your sleeping bag and gear. Suggest you pack inside a plastic bag first, in

case of a heavy rain.

- 3. Dress needs to be pre -1840, we will sleep in canvas tents, up to four can sleep on the boat.
- 4. Bring your own eating kit
- 5. Bring a couple dozen cookies, as we take a cookie break twice a day.
- 6. Rowing is based on size of crew, with 12 people, 4 row at a time for 1

hour, so it would be 1 hour rowing and 2 hours off. > Ed williams> 591-944-0736
