HOA Board Activities Update

Estimates have been received and approved by the Board for the addition of electricity at the 116th and MacArthur entrance. This will light the "Glenhurst" signage and will be completed this fall in time for holiday lighting.

The Board would like to recognize the following efforts of neighborhood volunteers:

Glenhurst HOA holds its annual meeting in February of each year. At this event we pass the budget and elect board officers. Meetings are held every month, or at the least every other month, depending on the issues at hand. They also conduct other seminars such as legal issues which provide a wealth of information and support. GLENHURST NEIGHBORHOOD PATROL

AS MOST OF YOU KNOW, WE HAVE A <u>VOLUNTARY</u> NEIGHBORHOOD PATROL. WE NEED MORE VOLUNTEERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PATROL AND INCREASE OUR VISIBILITY ON THE STREETS.

To participate in the Neighborhood Patrol, you will attend a 1 hour training program conducted by a member of the Oklahoma City Police force. The next training session is at the Hefner Police Station (122nd AND HEFNER PARKWAY ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 23, AT 7:00 P.M.).

Patrol teams consist of 2 people: 2 women, 2 men or a couple. If you don't have a partner, we can help you find one. Our neighborhood patrol groups patrol for only two hours a month at their convenience. No one has experienced a "situation" but if it does happen; you will not confront anyone or get directly involved. You would observe from a distance and call 911. With your help we can be a more effective crime deterrent in our neighborhood. Please help keep Glenhurst a safe and secure place to live.

Landscape Committee Report:

Another Oklahoma hot and dry summer season!! Most of our attention has been focused on irrigation issues for the common areas, trying to keep 101 stations on 4 control boxes operational. One control box at the gated area was broken into and the system turned off. Another station operating the pond area had a valve shut off by unknown person/persons. We continue to need everyone's help in reporting any irrigation problems to the board or landscape committee, so they can be addressed quickly.

The landscape improvement plans for this year have been on hold. The committee was waiting on confirmation from the City, as to what assistance they would provide to replace trees lost during the construction of the NW Library, before we committed our budget dollars. The City wanted to wait until after the NW Library opened to work on reviewing our requests for plant replacement. We finally met with them in mid July and now have a letter stating they will replace two Nellie Steven Holly trees on the west brick signage on 122nd and Glenhurst, and also two live oak trees lost on the divided Glenhurst median. This should be completed in late fall by their choice of contractor. The committee has received two tentative plans for review on improvements to the medians at entrances on Glenhurst Boulevard and 118th Street. A third plan will be requested before deciding on a contractor. We also have received a request from a resident to put a rock curbing around the beds at the 116th and MacArthur entrance. This has been done on the 118th and 122nd entrances. This will be considered after the lighting at 116th and MacArthur is completed this fall.

The covenant committee has been actively sending letters to homeowners to remind them of the covenants of our mandatory HOA. For the most part, cooperation of those with violations has been met. The board has received a few phone calls and/or emails for clarification of those letters. The HOA is appreciative of those who are interested in discussing the correction of covenant violations and the board may be contacted with compliance questions. A list of covenants is supplied at closing; a short list is delivered as part of the welcome basket, and a complete list may be found on our website www.glenhurstokc.com. According to legal counsel, knowledge of the covenants is the responsibility of the homeowner. The last round of letters sent by the committee included 29 for trees (either dead trees needing removal and replacement, or homes that did not have a tree required between the building line of the house and curb, 2 on corner lots), 5 for parking violations (cars with flat tires, cars on blocks, boats), 3 for trash cans left visible from the street, and 3 for basketball goals not stored out of site when not in use. The HOA appreciates the neighbors who have responded by replacing and/or adding 12 trees, and removal of 6 dead trees (still waiting on replacement). For those who have yet to respond to your letter to add or replace trees, remember late fall and early spring are the best times in OK to plant.

Responsible dog ownership in Oklahoma City: The committee has been asked to remind homeowners that there is a City ordinance (with applicable fine) for failure to pick up waste after your dogs. A complete set of the ordinances of Oklahoma concerning dog ownership and control can be found at

http://www.okc.gov/code/index.html. Click on "Oklahoma City Municipal Code" and go to "Chapter VIII: Animals".

Always remember, the best way to address a concern is to get to know your neighbors so that you may address concerns with them to make it a win-win for all. Our covenants are tools to keep our neighborhood attractive and valuable.
