Dear Branches

Attached is a brochure created by the Monash University School of Clinical Sciences discussing the support given by the Ulysses Club via the Ulysses Club Research Fund co-ordinated by Kim Kennerson. You may like to distribute this to members via your Branch Newsletters.

In this BranchComms we are also reproducing a letter from Liz Tester, detailing the ride she is doing to raise funds both for UCARF and RFDS. Her Itinerary is also attached.

CHARITY RIDE, by Liz Tester #52236

Greetings fellow Ulysses Club members.

My name is Liz Tester, I am 48 years old and live at Capel in the South Western region of Western Australia. Capel is 212 kilometres south of Perth halfway between Bunbury and Busseltown and I have been associated with the Bunbury Branch for approximately 6 years. For the last 3 years I have been riding my own motorcycle, a Yamaha 650cc V-Star Cruiser.

So far life's journey has not always been easy and has thrown me a few challenges along the way. From the age of 14 years until I reached 30 I suffered from epilepsy and despite medication often had several minor seizures per day. Needless to say I was unable to obtain a drivers licence necessitating a reliance on family for transport.

In November 1997 I underwent brain surgery to remove a benign tumour from my right temporal globe. The successful operation was life changing for me, I obtained my first drivers licence at age 32 and have been seizure free life for the past 18 years.

In early 2000 I had a skydiving accident in Busselton. I landed awkwardly fracturing a vertebra in my lower back resulting in a transfer to Perth for hospitalisation via the Royal Flying Doctor Service. I spent four weeks at Shenton Park Campus of the Royal Perth Hospital before returning home in a brace to recover. Shenton Park was a purpose built rehabilitation service facility which closed in 2014 after servicing the community for 121 years. Thankfully I had a good outcome although I have ongoing pain and receive chiropractic treatment. I met my current partner in May 2007 and was introduced to motorcycling. I soon found a strong passion for this lifestyle and found that riding has given me a new freedom.

My experiences have developed my philosophy on life and I believe in living it to the full, taking nothing for granted and enjoying the little things.

I feel indebted to the RFDS and would like to create some payback. Hence I am undertaking a charity ride

beginning on the 31st July 2016 to raise funds travelling around mainland Australia rattling the tin. I will be initially escorted by Bunbury Branch and will then meet up with the Warnbro Sound Wanderers Branch at Baldivis who will ride with me to Joondalup. I will be supported on the trip by my husband who will be following in a Kia Sprinter motorhome.

Some local fund raising has already been achieved by myself and some members of the Bunbury Branch including raffles, an open garden and a quiz night. This has achieved a total fund to date of #3,659.40 towards our undetermined charity goal. I would especially like to thank Bunbury members Grub, Steve and Greg. All proceeds from the charity ride will be split 50/50 between RFDS and UCARF and I have provided a full itinerary. Your support along the journey would be greatly appreciated.





On Thursday the 7th July 2016, members of the Lockyer and Ipswich Ulysses branches (plus one friend) gave up their time to either show their bikes off or give rides at Focal's Vacation Care Program for children with disabilities.

Firstly on behalf of Focal Community Living Inc., Kerri Siebenhausen (Out of School Hours Care Coordinator), and Elise Campbell (2IC Senior Vacation Care), Support staff and especially the children, we wish to say "a very BIG THANK YOU for such generous support to the Vacation Care program".

In total (if I counted right) we had 18 bikes come along - 1 trike, 3 x Can Am Spyders and 14 x 2 wheelers. It was amazing to even hear them arrive let alone see them all parked.





The anticipation of the Bikes event had been building from the first day of the school holidays (the week before), so the excitement really amped up once the bikes actually arrived. A few of the children were quite hesitant at first, but in the end we couldn't keep them away, and everyone finished up going for not just one but two rides. Some were just shaking with excitement. They were packed with emotions - smiles you can see for miles. For some it was - a dream come true. Immediately the children were asking "Can they come back?" "When are they coming back?" Out of all the children there were about 3 that did not want to or could not go on the bikes, however staff ensured that they could see the parked bikes from the room or visit the parked bikes, and have a look/listen/feel of the different bikes on display. One young person in particular comes to mind; he really loved the feel of the Fox Tail, enjoying the sensory experience. I could see his smile from 20 metres away. For those children that were not so strong in the core area, were able to put them onto the Spyder, with a staff member and the rider either side. As you can imagine it was really hard to talk the staff into assisting, NOT!!! In fact several staff finished up having a turn on the Spyder's, without a child. 


It really was a terrific event, there was tons of enthusiasm and excitement and lots of FUN was had by all...




