Friday, November 17th is the Haldeman Mansion Preservation Society's. "Help Us Get the Word Out" Day. The day we hope to raise funds to develop a more vigorous publicity program to help better showcase our Locust Grove's property & history; to advertise our events and to grow our membership. The program's focus will be to advertise our Sunday open house tours: social events: educational programs; and the mansion and ground's availability for special event and occasion photography rentals.In case you are not aware of November 17th's significance, we are referring to Lancaster County Community Foundation's (LCCF) 2017 ExtraOrdinary Give Campaign.

This year's campaign is similar to previous years. Anyone with a credit card and access to the internet can donate. All donations must be made online by either MasterCard, Visa. Discover or American Express credit cards. Donations will be accepted at the Extraordinary Day of Giving website (https:// extragive.org/). Minimum donations are \$25. Every dollar donated will be stretched by at least \$500,000 from the Lancaster County Community Foundation. All participating non-profit organizations will receive a pro-rated portion of this "stretch pool." For example, if an organization receives 1% of the total

donations raised during the Extraordinary Give, then that organization will receive 1% of the stretch pool. This year, Golden Ticket Awards will total \$36,000, i.e., during each of the below timeslots, Golden Ticket prizes will be randomly awarded to individual donors. A Golden Ticket is an additional \$1,000 prize added to a donor's gift. Example: A donor makes a \$25 gift. They are selected for a Golden Ticket, so the organization receives not \$25, but \$1,025! Donations are tax deductible. You will receive a receipt via email immediately following your donation.

## THE SUMMER KITCHEN/SMOKEHOUSE/ICEHOUSE HAS A NEW ROOF



The roof consists of hand split western red cedar shakes installed by MR-Roofing( Manheim, Pa). The previous cedar shingle roof was in remarkably good shape given it was installed in the late 1970s, but was nearing the end of its useful life. The construction date of the summer kitchen is not precisely known, but is suspected

to date to the mid to late 1700s. This attractive structure was restored in the mid-1970s as part of the initial restoration efforts at the Haldeman mansion. We are pleased to do our part to ensure the long-term prospects of the summer kitchen with the financial assistance of the Lancaster County Community Foundation's John Snyder grant .


#### 2017 KRISTKINDLE MART
