

FENCES ARE CONSIDERED ACCESSORY IN TIPPECANOE COUNTY:

- A single-family, two-family or multi-family home is considered a primary use.
- A fence is **accessory** to the primary use and is permitted on the same lot as the primary use.



An accessory use, accessory structure or accessory building is incidental to and associated with a primary use on the same lot. Accessory uses, structures and buildings are permitted in all zones in which their associated primary uses are permitted.


WHERE CAN I PUT THE FENCE ON MY PROPERTY?

Can I put a Fence in my Front Yard?

You may put a fence in your front yard ONLY if it does not exceed 42" (3 1/2') in height and does not cross into an easement.

A general rule of thumb...fences taller than 42" should not be erected any closer to the street than the front of a house.

WHAT ABOUT MY BACK YARD?

Fences may be placed on side (outside of the front setback) or rear lot lines except where it crosses or obstructs a drainage easement or a utility easement. If you have questions about the locations of easements, please contact our office at 423-9242.

For corner lots or through lots (a lot with a street at the front and the rear) fences may exceed the height limit of 42" and may be closer to the street at the side or rear yard, but only with the approval of the Administrative Officer for your jurisdiction (the City Engineer's Offices for the cities; the Building Commissioner for unincorporated Tippecanoe County; and APC for Battle Ground, Clarks Hill & Dayton).
