1- Start with an anecdote (something that happened to you):

2- Start with a bit of dialogue:

3- Start with an "imagining":

Imagine a being with a head as big as a classroom and a body as small as a mouse's. Perhaps such a being --and many others just as strange-- exist in other planets.

4- Start with a description:

Swirling, colorful clouds made up of hydrogen gas, violent winds, a size and a mass much greater than Earth's, and more than a dozen moons glowing in the sky. That gives you an idea of what you would experience if you visited Jupiter.

5- Start with a question:

Can you imagine what it would be like to travel through space and visit new worlds? I certainly can.

6- Start with an interesting statement:

I read in an astronomy book that Saturn's density is so small that it would float in a bathtub full of water (provided we could get a bathtub big enough and enough water, of course).

7- Start with a definition:

The dictionary defines adventure as an exciting or extraordinary event involving uncertainty and risk. Would I have what it takes to experience the adventure of visiting other planets?
