Second Grade at a Glance

Reading: For reading instruction, we'll use



the McGraw Hill Reading Series. We will read a new story from our textbook each week, which we'll use for comprehension, vocabulary,

fluency, & more. Students will also participate in small group reading instruction. We will utilize The Daily 5 to organize our reading instruction time.

Writer's Workshop: Our class will write each and



every day! During writer's workshop, students will be invited to write about topics that are meaningful and important to them. Each child will work at their own pace and choose their own topics to write about. We will write a lot of

"sloppy copies" before taking stories through the writing process (revising, editing, and finally publishing).



Math: The math curriculum we use is Saxon Math. We will begin our day with "The Math Meeting" during which we'll practice essential math skills using the

calendar, a weather graph, a clock, and more. Later in the day we will present the new math concept for the day. Students will be guided through written practice of this new concept.

Science: We will study Plants, Earth's Land



& Matter. Study Plants, Earth's Land & Matter. Students will read about concepts and participate in hands on experiences.

Social Studies: In Social Studies, students



will learn all about their Community. We will study communities of the past & present.

read for 15 minutes every night. There is no reason your child shouldn't finish their work in class. If you see an extreme amount of homework coming home, please talk with your child about using their time wisely to complete their work during class.

your child each day. The snack should be something small that can be eaten in 5 minutes or less. Your child is also welcome to bring a water bottle

Data Binders Students will be given a Data Binder



where they will enter and chart their weekly test scores. Data Binders will be filled out on Wednesdays and sent home for parents to preview, sign, and return the next day. These Data

Binders will kept in the classroom. All papers need to remain in the Data Binders until we remove them at the end of each trimester and place them in their portfolios.

Spelling Tests Students will be given a list of



spelling words every Friday. It will contain 15 words that they will be test on the following Friday. Your child will also have 3 dictation sentences that will be graded for punctuation and correct use of spelling grammar. The

sentences will consist of past spelling words, sight words, and grammar skills that your child should know. These dictation sentences are used to see if your child is retaining their spelling words and have
