NRHP Report History buffs can read the full report submitted to the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) and view photographs dating back to 1905.

Veterans The new website maintains the current alphabetical listing of Riverview Cemetery Veterans with links to Find A Grave Memorial pages.

Section Maps Visitors can now access maps that show the underground layout. If you have a Deed with the Section and Lot number you will be able to take yourself to the site. If you only have a name, FHRC Board members will search the database and provide the exact location to you. We remain available to escort visitors to a gravesite by appointment or when we are on site for projects.

Slide Shows The new website contains lots of photos in slideshow format: You will find examples of volunteers at work, the amazing story of the "Birth of the Baby Garden", Memorial Day Services, and people of interest whose final resting place is at Riverview.

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

As indicated in the June Newsletter, The Trustees of The Longwood Foundation will provide \$50,000 toward the renovation of the chapel/office into the Visitor and Information Center after we have raised an additional \$50,000. This is a strong statement of support. We are happy to report that the Directors of the Laffey-McHugh Foundation provided FHRC with a \$7500 grant in June. Help us raise the "\$50K match" this summer. The final phase of construction depends on this \$100K funding opportunity.
