Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Hello all – blessings to you! As I begin this newsletter after being away from writing these sermonettes for a while, I must be honest and tell you how tired I am of the national news in the almost two months since I wrote the last one. What I read in the morning and what I hear on the radio, I must say, has my head ready to explode! I am tired of the constant barrage of disputes and arguments, the relentless quarreling and the non-stop wrangling to try and prove whose opinion is right. It seems as if everyone's ethical principles are under a microscope and its becoming harder all the time to determine whose reporting is reliable. And maybe that is the point; maybe what those who hold power actually want is for the population to get so fed up that we become apathetic and unconcerned. While I hope that never happens no matter how demanding and tiring it may become to keep abreast of our current political and social situation, one thing I hope for all of us is that we can all find some peace and hope in the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ.

At our last rummage sale I found a little treasure in the book section titled – “Words of Life.” If this came from someone in our congregation I thank you for your donation. This book is a compilation of inspirational quotations with a religious context. A short passage I found in the chapter Prayer is from an unknown author. It is titled “Three Things” and I think it might help all of us with the constant barrage of negativity we face each day from our media.

Three Things

*“I know three things must always be to keep a nation strong and free:
One is a hearthstone bright and dear, with busy happy loved ones near;
One is a ready heart and hand, to love and serve and keep the land;
One is a worn and beaten way, to where the people go to pray.”
“So long as these are kept alive, Nation and people will survive;
God keep them always, everywhere – the home, the heart, the place for prayer.”*

Now while I imagine that the author, whoever it may be, was talking about our individual homes, families and churches – I would offer that this can also be heard as a prayer for the importance of the community of faithful people of Jesus Christ. I say this because as a community we too can offer a warm hearth to those who are lost or abandoned, those who live on the fringes of society and who have been forgotten by their families. Neighbors in Need Sunday- October 7

Neighbors in Need offering will be received on World Communion Sunday, October 7. This offering supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service

projects. Through ucc.org/justice, our national Justice and Witness Ministries office offers resources, news updates, and action alerts on a broad spectrum of justice issues. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors of the UCC. One-third of the offering supports UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. Please give generously!


