Application Process (Deviation from this process will result in disqualification.):

- 1. Applicants will complete the attached application and mail to:

- 2. All applications must be postmarked no later than April 1, 2021
- 3. Scholarship applications are awarded for participation in educational horse clinics or private lessons. Due to the lesser value of a one hour private lesson, if requesting a scholarship for multiple private lessons, the total amount requested must be in general equivalence to the cost of a multiple day clinic.
- 4. Applications will proceed to a six-person committee where they will be anonymously evaluated based on predetermined criteria. If the committee determines that the applicant be awarded a scholarship, an amount will be determined according to Luminere Scholarship Fund guidelines.
 - 5. Applicants will be notified via email of acceptance or denial of the scholarship application.
- 6. The Luminere Scholarship Fund is a formal application process; written, printed or typed applications are acceptable. Neatness and grammar are valued.
- 7. A scholarship may be applied to an alternate clinic or lesson within the same calendar year as the scholarship awarded. Scholarship holder must provide reasonable cause for the transfer. Any changes must be approved by the Luminere Committee.
 - 8. All scholarships are non-transferable; specific to person requested in application.
 - 9. Stock Horse of Wisconsin does not discriminate, and all applications will be considered.
- 10. All applications will remain confidential to the Luminere Committee and will not be shared with others outside of the committee.
- 11. If there are questions about a scholarship please contact a Stock Horse of Wisconsin Officer or a Luminere Committee Member. Your questions will be addressed in a timely manner.
