From the Pastor's Desk

Dear brothers and sisters,

Today we hear of two widows in the Word of the Lord. These widows bring to light a very important reality called "trust in God". To understand we need to explain the reality of a widow in Ancient Jewish Society. First, a widow did not have any protections under the law – widows and orphans were the people that could be trampled upon and could not defend themselves. Second, widows could not possess property without a male relative vouching for them. Finally, there was not financial safe net for them. In this light let us listen to the word of God again. In the first reading there is a widow in Zarephath that was collecting wood to cook her last meal and die because of the famine in the land. The prophet comes and ask her for a piece of bread and then she can cook for herself. It seems that the prophet is asking for everything that she has and then she can die. The Gospel puts is in front of a widow that gives all she possesses and leaves the temple with nothing to fend for herself and Jesus praises her. Here is the dilemma, these widows know something that we many times do not – that God provides! But not just as phrase we say but as a reality. They have the experience that God truly is defender of the widows and protector of the orphans (one of the most ancient titles of God). They truly trust God to the end and can live the moment trusting that God will not abandon them. It is a wonderful way to live, not in anxiety but trusting that we are taken care. I invite you to ask God for that grace, to live as his children. Next week we will have our Friendsgiving in the parish! I invite you all to participate and be together to enjoy in our parish a moment of love and community as part of our Vines and Branches. Please make sure to attend and participate.

Hoy escuchamos de dos viudas en la Palabra del Señor. Estas viudas sacan a la luz una realidad muy importante llamada "confianza en Dios". Para entender, necesitamos explicar la realidad de una viuda en la antigua sociedad judía. Primero, una viuda no tenía ninguna protección bajo la ley: las viudas y los huérfanos eran personas que podían ser pisoteadas y no podían defenderse. En segundo lugar, las viudas no podían poseer propiedades sin un parente varón que las atestiguara. Finalmente, no existía una red financiera segura para ellos. En esta luz, escuchemos de nuevo la palabra de Dios. En la primera lectura hay una viuda en Sarepta que estaba recolectando leña para cocinar su última comida y morir a causa del hambre en la tierra. El profeta viene y le pide un trozo de pan y luego puede cocinar ella misma. Parece que el profeta está pidiendo todo lo que tiene y luego puede morir. El Evangelio se pone delante de una viuda que da todo lo que posee y sale del templo sin nada que valerse por sí misma y Jesús la alaba. Aquí está el dilema, estas viudas saben algo que muchas veces nosotros no sabemos, ¡que Dios provee! Pero no solo como frase que decimos, sino como realidad. Tienen la experiencia de que Dios verdaderamente es defensor de las viudas y protector de los huérfanos (uno de los títulos más antiguos de Dios). Realmente confían en Dios hasta el final y pueden vivir el momento confiando en que Dios no los abandonará. Es una manera maravillosa de vivir, no con ansiedad sino confiando en que nos cuidan. Los invito a pedirle a Dios esa gracia, a vivir como sus hijos.

Hoje ouvimos falar de duas viúvas na Palavra do Senhor. Essas viúvas trazem à luz uma realidade muito importante chamada "confiança em Deus". Para entender, precisamos explicar a realidade de uma viúva na Antiga Sociedade Judaica. Primeiro, uma viúva não tinha nenhuma proteção legal - viúvas e órfãos eram as pessoas que podiam ser pisoteadas e não podiam se defender. Em segundo lugar, as viúvas não podiam possuir propriedades sem um parente do sexo masculino garantindo por elas. Finalmente, não havia rede de segurança financeira para eles. Sob esta luz, vamos ouvir a palavra de Deus novamente. Na primeira leitura, há uma viúva em Sarepta que coletava lenha para cozinhar sua última refeição e morrer por causa da fome na terra. O profeta vem e pede a ela um pedaço de pão e então ela pode cozinhar para si mesma. Parece que o profeta está pedindo tudo o que ela tem e então ela pode morrer. O Evangelho coloca diante de uma viúva que dá tudo o que possui e sai do templo sem nada para se defender e Jesus a elogia. Aqui está o dilema, essas viúvas sabem algo que muitas vezes não sabemos - que Deus fornece! Mas não apenas como frase, dizemos, mas como uma realidade. Eles têm a experiência de que Deus é verdadeiramente defensor das viúvas e protetor dos órfãos (um dos títulos mais antigos de Deus). Eles realmente confiam em Deus até o fim e podem viver o momento confiando que Deus não os abandonará. É uma maneira maravilhosa de viver, não com ansiedade, mas confiando que somos bem cuidados. Convido você a pedir a Deus essa graça, a viver como seus filhos. Na próxima semana teremos o nosso Amizade na paróquia! Convido todos vocês a participarem e juntos desfrutarem em nossa paróquia um momento de amor e comunidade como parte de nossas Vinhas e Ramos. Por favor, certifique-se de comparecer e participar.
