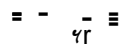

Our Clinicians

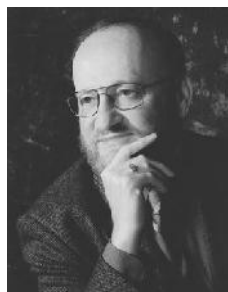


David Gorham has been Director of Bands at Owasso High School since 1989. Previously, he served five years in Van Buren, Arkansas, as Eighth Grade band director, where he consistently received Superior ratings in concert and sight-reading. At Owasso High School, he oversees the band department; conducts the Wind Ensemble, Concert Band II, and the Pride of Owasso marching band; and teaches AP Music Theory. The ensembles under his leadership have all earned Superior ratings at every event for the past twenty-four years. The Wind Ensemble performed at the Midwest Clinic in 1999 & 2012, and has been an Oklahoma Music Educators' Association Honor Group seven times. The band program has been awarded the Sudler Flag of Honor and Sudler Shield by the Sousa Foundation. The marching band has performed in the Pasadena Tournament of Roses Parade under his leadership. Also, they have been finalists at BOA Regionals in St. Louis, Arlington, San Antonio, Las Vegas, Atlanta, and Grand Nationals Championships.

Mr. Gorham, a graduate of Hope High School in 1978, was born in Hope, Arkansas. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Music Education in 1982 and his Master of Music Education in 1993, both from the University of Arkansas.

Mr. Gorham, a member of Phi Beta Mu and the American Bandmasters Association, was selected as the Oklahoma Bandmasters Association Director of the Year for 1997. In addition, he was the 1988 Arkansas ASBDA-Stanbury Award winner and the 1992 South Central Region ASBDA-Stanbury Award winner. In 2006, Mr. Gorham was the National Federation of High Schools Section 6 recipient of the Outstanding Music Educator Award. He was a recipient of the Oklahoma Music Educators Association Exemplary Teacher award in 2010, and Bandworld Legion of Honor Laureate in 2011.

Mr. Gorham has over 80 published works for concert band, all published by Wingert-Jones Music Co., Barnhouse, and Southern Music Co. which have been included on contest lists in the United States, Australia, and Japan. He has composed a number of commissioned works for groups throughout the country, including the University of Arkansas Wind Ensemble, Arkansas All-State Band, the North Hills Symphony Band (Pittsburgh, PA), and the United States Air Force Band of Mid-America.



David Newell taught music for thirty years in the public schools of Berea, Ohio. Additionally, he taught part-time for fifteen years for the Music Education Department at Baldwin-Wallace University. During his tenure as Director of Bands at Ford Middle School, Mr. Newell developed one of the exemplary band programs in the state and served as Chair of the Music and Art Departments. In 1979, Mr. Newell received the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation's "Master Teacher" Award for Excellence in the Classroom. He also received the "Alumni Achievement" Award from Baldwin-Wallace University in 1987. Mr. Newell's clinics are being paid for by **Kjos Publishing**
