

Happy 2022! I hope you had a Merry Christmas and a happy start to this New Year. Now in my defense, when we usually park downtown it is in a different parking garage that is near Victoria's (an excellent Italian restaurant) and at that garage you insert your debit card to enter and insert it again when you leave as that is how it charges you. Not the case with this garage and as I quickly read the sign I only saw part of it and assumed it was like the other. We all know what happens when you assume! We all do that though don't we — assume. We assume that this next year will be better. We assume that the church will go on as usual. We assume that it will be there and the people who have sat in the same pew for years will be in the same spot when I come on Sunday morning. Then we had to close our doors in 2020 and 2021.

I hope and pray that we do not have to do that again this year. I do not know what the future holds but I do know that God is in control and God has brought us through safely thus far and will continue to do it again.
