

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

To us a child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of peace. The prophesy from Isaiah 9:6 has been fulfilled and at this time of year we celebrate that event. Our celebrations started with carol services in all our churches during morning service except the last one: Carols by Candlelight in St Nicholas' Church on Tuesday 21st December. It was a wonderful occasion with the church filled to covid-safe capacity. The collection that night was earmarked for two local charities: Women's Aid and the Simon Community each received €500. I wish to thank Evelyn and Sharon, all members of the choir and those who helped by decorating the church and stewarding on the night.

We had joy but we also had sorrow; on 16th December, the earthly remains of Maureen Matthews were laid to rest in the graveyard of St Mary's Church, Ardee following her funeral service in St Nicholas' church. I am grateful to the graveyard committee for facilitating the burial, having the church open and the bell rung.

With the rapid spread of the omicron variant of covid, many people were disappointed because Christmas arrangements had to be changed. Despite their disappointment, so many families have behaved responsibly, taking antigen or PCR tests before finally committing to the family gathering, arranging the gathering outdoors or simply postponing their gathering until finer weather.

In this Newsletter you will see some more outdoor pictures of people planting trees. The 'Bugs Bees and Native Trees' project was completed this month and thank you to the young people and their parents who helped at the plantings. Thank you, to David Brown in Armagh and Tori in our parochial group, for initiating and co-ordinating the project.

With the knowledge of traditional attendances at the Christmas services in our smaller churches we were able to estimate that we could hold services safely and within government guidelines, so unlike last year, we had Christmas services in all the churches. We thank Revd Christine McCrea who conducted the services in Ballymascanlan and Bush. Thanks also to Lord Bellew for his help to keep the normal pattern of services in all our churches and to Rita for all she does.

I apologise to at least 2 families for a time error printed in the Newsletter for the united service on 26thDecember. This was my fault, as I gave the wrong time to Tori.

The Dundalk Select Vestry looks forward to completing the sale of the former rectory early in the new year. They will then be in a position to seek a new house to replace it.

Bugs, Bees and Native Trees initiative

Following on from the tree planting initiative 'BUGS, BEES AND NATIVE TREES' at *St. Nicholas Parish Church (The Green Church)* back in November on an overcast Saturday in December the Rev. Richard Moore with the help from Ms Tori Eveson and many more parishioners took to *St. Mary's Church Ballymascanlan, St. Andrew's Church Rathcor Bush, St. Paul's Church Heynestown Creggan Parish Church Crossmaglen.*

The 'Bugs, Bees and Native Trees' project continue planting three trees in each Church grounds.

The Diocese of Armagh, the "Bugs, Bees and Native trees" project and Christian Aid (Ireland) have teamed up to plant local species of trees across Parishes supporting children in being more aware of better protecting God's gift of creation, locally and globally.

Ms Tori Eveson of St. Nicholas Parish Church who is committee member of the AYAC (Armagh Youth and Children) in the Diocese of Armagh organized some members of the church from Sunday school, Mothers' Union and the church choir, all helped plant trees and shrubs within the church yard which is part of the "Bugs, Bees and Native Trees" initiative.

The Bugs, Bees and Native Trees, is to support young people and concerned citizens on the island of Ireland to address issues of the environment, biodiversity and climate change through tree planting and environmental community initiatives.


