KIVUNG was founded in 1968 as the Journal of the Linguistic Society of Papua New Guinea. It is concerned with all branches of linguistics, although preference will be given to contributions of general theoretical interest, to articles dealing with the languages of Papua New Guinea, and to the application of linguistic research to the teaching of language.

Beginning in 1975, KIVUNG will be published twice a year, in June and December (see enclosed notice). Articles, books for review, and other items of interest should be sent to the Editor, Kivung, Department of Language, Box 4820, University, Papua New Guinea. Authors of articles and reviews receive six copies gratis and may receive additional copies at cost.

Subscription rates, which include membership of the Linguistic Society of Papua New Guinea, are \$A1.00 per year for undergraduate students of tertiary institutions in Papua New Guinea, \$A5.00 per year for other individuals, and \$A10.00 per year for institutions (rising to \$12.00 per year in 1975). Airmail rates and rates for back issues will be supplied on request. Subscriptions and enquiries should be directed to Kivung, Department of Language, Box 4820, University, Papua New Guinea.

Prospective contributors should observe the following guidelines for the format of contributions. Manuscripts should be the top typed copy, double-spaced, with wide margins, and typed on one side of the paper only. Footnotes, which should be kept to a minimum, should appear on a separate page at the end of the manuscript; references to publications within the body of the text should give merely author, date of publication, and page numbers where necessary : e.g., Chomsky (1965); Capell (1962a: 129 - 165). A list of references should also appear as a separate page, and references should be of the following form:
