All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism...



WORD OF GOD

• CHILDREN'S MESSAGE

Theme: Temptation Object: Foam Finger

Scripture: Matthew 4:1-17

Hello girls and boys. I hope you all had a great week. I'm so happy you are here today. Today we're going to talk about temptation and sin. Doesn't that sound fun?... Well, our Bible story has Jesus out in the wilderness. Have you ever been in the wilderness? It any place where you feel like you're all alone and nobody is there to help you. Jesus had been out there by himself for a long time, The Bible says 40 days. That's when the Tempter or Satan come to him and tries to get him to turn some rocks into bread to eat. That would be pretty tempting, wouldn't it? Then the Devil tempts Jesu to jump off the roof of the Church. He says God will send angels to catch you and you won't fall. Finally the devil says

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look at all the treasure of the whole earth. All this can be yours if you just worship me!

I'll tell you how Jesus answered the devil in a minute, but first I want to show you my big foam finger. I like to take this to baseball games to show that I'm rooting for my team. I think this foam finger can also help us understand how Jesus defeated the devil out there in the wilderness.

So, the devil says turn these stones into bread and eat. Jesus might have held up a giant finger and said, no thank you. God is number one and I only follow what God says. Then the devil says since you're God's only son throw yourself off the roof and let's see if God will catch you on the way down. Once again, Jesus holds up his giant foam finger and says to the devil, "No way Jose! God is number one and I have no need to test his love for me. I already know God loves me so I don't need to throw myself off the roof to prove it." Finally, the devil offers Jesu all the riches of the world. Guess what! Jesus holds up his foam finger and loudly says, "I don't need any of those trinkets. I already have the best treasure in the whole world. God is number one in my life and nothing can be better than that!"

Jesus was tempted and we are all also tempted. Jesus resisted the devil by constantly remembering that God was number one. Maybe we can do that too. When we're tempted to do something we know is wrong, we can remember that God is number one in our lives and that will give us the courage to tell the devil to go away and leave us alone!

Let's pray for God's help when we're tempted. Dear Jesus, thank you for being our perfect example for how to deal with the devil's temptations. Thank you for showing us how to keep God as number one in our lives. Amen.

• SCRIPTURE READING: Matthew 4:1-17

P: The Holy Gospel according to Saint Matthew, the fourth chapter. C: Glory to you O Lord.

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. ²He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished. ³The tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." ⁴But he answered, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." ⁵Then the devil took him to the holy city and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, ⁶saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." ⁷Jesus said to him,

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"Again it is written, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test." ⁸Again, the devil

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took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor; ⁹and he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." ¹⁰Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." ¹¹Then the devil left him, and suddenly angels came and waited on him.

¹²Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. ¹³He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, ¹⁴so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: ¹⁵"Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles— ¹⁶the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned." ¹⁷From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

C: Praise to You, O Christ (Spoken)

• SERMON Pr Mel Musser
Grace and peace to you from God our Father and from the Sinless One,

Jesus Christ our Savior and our Lord, amen.

We don't like to talk about sin or being tempted. Even in religious circles we tend to avoid especially talking about our own specific sins or what tempts us. Oh, we Lutherans freely confess we're by nature sinful and unclean, but when it comes down to specifics we don't want to talk about what we've done or left undone. I'm not so sure confessing individual specific sins is all that important. God knows what you've done and left undone. I'm pretty sure I couldn't come up with a full and complete list of every sin I've committed anyway. Besides God knows what to do about all the junk in our lives anyway... Do you remember the story in John's Gospel about the wedding in the town of Cana in Galilee? Pretty early in the celebration the host of the party ran out of wine. Mary, the mother of

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Jesus said to her son, "They have run out of wine." She told Jesus the problem in only 6 words. Jesus knew what to do and the party had the best wine in so much abundance they could have partied for a month. That's not how we usually pray and not how individual confession goes either. If I'd have been the one who noticed they were out of wine, I would have given more specific instructions as to what Jesus should do. "Jesus, send Judas and James to the corner liquor store to buy that good red wine. We need about 2 or 3 more cases. You can take up a collection after you get back, but here's my credit card to use for now... Mary simply told Jesus the problem and trusted him to make things right.

By now you're probably thinking, Pastor, what does all this have to do with the story of Jesus being tempted by Satan. If sin is the result of giving in to temptation then it's fundamental to who we are as human beings. The temptation to sin is all around us. It never takes a break nor does it take the day off on all federal holidays or even on Air Force Family days. Temptation is persistent and pervasive. The sins each temptation represents are like a huge smorgasbord. We might not take up adultery, but we sure do enjoy a good gossip or two.

We've been studying the Ten Commandments in Catechism Class. Martin Luther's explanation for the Fifth Commandment, Thou Shall not Murder is one of my favorites. Most of us would probably say, at least we haven't broken that one. Do we have any murderers here today? Before you all start patting yourselves on

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the back because you haven't stabbed anyone in the back, listen to what Jesus had to say about this in the Sermon on the mount from Matthew, chapter 5. ²¹ "You have heard that it was said to those of ancient times, 'You shall not murder'; and 'whoever murders shall be liable to judgment.' ²² But I say to you that if you are angry with a brother or sister, you will be liable to judgment; and if you insult a brother or sister, you will be liable to the council; and if you say, 'You fool,' you will be liable to the hell of fire." So, anyone here never been angry with another person? Anyone ever called someone a fool or worse?

We are all sinners who fall for the devil's temptations every day. The Bible tells us all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Scripture also tells us Jesus was human in every way, except that he was without sin. Jesus faced the same temptations we all face, but he had an answer to every temptation Satan threw his way. The three temptations in the Gospel for today are really models for all temptations. Here's what I mean. Jesus must have been near starvation when the devil tempted him to turn the stones into bread. The Tempter comes to him and says, "Come on Jesus, you have to eat. How can you help others if you're too weak to help? Besides, you can make enough bread to feed not only yourself, but the entire world. Isn't that a worthy cause? Think about it... No more starving people anywhere! Come on Jesus. Make some bread out of these stones and eat!" Jesus knew he didn't come to earth to *make* our bread, but to *be* our bread.

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The second temptation is for Jesus to throw himself off the pinnacle of the Temple. We all trust God to some extent, but how many of us would trust enough to jump from the Empire State Building and hope God would send an angel or two to catch us on the way down... Yet we put God to the test on a daily basis. In big and little wats. We pray for healing for our loved ones who are in the process of dying and expect God to perform a miracle like He's a trained seal in a Sea World show. God is not our cosmic slot machine that we can pull his lever or push His buttons and expect our will to be done. We fall for this temptation over and over. When I was in school, I would consistently fail to study on a daily basis and then try to cram it all in the night before the big exam. My prayer before the test was always, God, please get me through this with a passing grade and I promise to study more regularly in the future. I was putting God to the test by not being prepared and then expecting God to get me through...

Finally, the third temptation... Who doesn't want fame, or money, or power? We're talking greed here... Scripture tells us the love of money is the root of all evil. It's not the money itself, but the love of money that causes us to fall into this trap. Just like Abraham and the Chosen people of God in ancient days, we're also blessed to be a blessing to the nations of the world. You see money isn't the problem. Money is a blessing. God asks us to use it to be a blessing to our neighbors.

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None of us likes to talk about the temptations that cause us to sin. I'm just happy God doesn't require us to continuously go over and over all those times when we gave in to the temptations of this world. I'm also happy that God knew all the way back at the beginning we couldn't solve our sin problem by just being a better version of ourselves. If there was going to be a solution to our sin problem, God would have to take care of it Himself. That's just what God did! Jesus said he did not come to abolish the law, but to fulfill it. In encountering the tempter face to face and smacking him down, Jesus did confront every temptation we face, but came out on the other side unscathed, and even more importantly, without sin.

These temptations may seem far removed from the sins we face day in and day out, but I suggest these are templates the Devil uses, adapts, and reuses over and over to catch us in his trap. Think of them as leaving God out of the picture of life and you controlling your life. Control, power, accountability, those are the sins of our lives. We like to pretend, to play games with others and with God that we're not as bad as someone else we can point a finger at. Then we sit back in the smugness of our own sin and pride. Living life my way are the call words for many people, especially Americans who love to be fiercely independent. One of the fast-food chains had a slogan a few years ago, saying, "Have it your way!" Maybe some will remember Frank Sinatra's hit song, "I did it my way!" You and I

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like to have things our own way. We want to take God out of the picture of our lives. We want to control and run our lives our way.

A final story... The tragedy left the man homeless, widowed and childless. Fire swept through the trailer, and all was lost. It took some time for the full weight of the loss to descend, and when it did, he was nearly crushed. Like Job he would not be comforted.....When the gift of shock was lifted, anger and resentment filled every waking thought. God had not been fair to him -- God had not protected his family. He had not come to him with a special visitation to explain the "why" or the 'what next." He was in a wilderness as God forsaken as the Dead Sea... The greatest temptation was to add to his losses by giving up on his faith. He felt justified. No one would fault him. Some might even support him. He prayed angrily now, daring God to hurt him further, and challenging Him to give any reason to hold on to the thin thread of his faith that was left. He prayed angrily, but he prayed, and God could handle it... The anguish continued to mount until one afternoon he uttered a cry so forcefully, it could only be described as a scream. No word was spoken, just a loud angry scream against the forces of heaven and hell, as if to say, "I've hurt all I can, and I've paid my dues for love... Please, help me!" The silence that followed was quieter than death itself. Then a peace was evident for the first time in months. Scripture might have said, "Angels came and ministered unto him." Satan had been overthrown, and health was

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coming back, for he trusted, at last, God was caring for those he lost. God was caring for him. God could handle his honest anger, and his honest emotions.

May the God of love and mercy send his angels to minister to you in your times of temptation and loss. May you find the comfort of knowing Jesus Christ has already paid the price for your sin and no temptation nor any sin is so strong that it can steal you from the hands of your savior, Jesus Christ. Thanks be to God for taking away my sin and yours. Amen.

P: Receive our prayers and hold all for whom we pray in your loving arms, in the name of your son, Jesus Christ.
