Preschool: I can't believe we are already half way through September! Last Tuesday we started going to the school library. We will do this each Tuesday, so please make sure your child returns their book so they can check out a new one! This week we will talk about the letter "B". We will also learn about butterflies and bats! Work with your child on writing their names. If they are having trouble, make dots and have them trace it. Don't forget pictures, on Thursday!

Kind: Happy Monday! This week our theme will be Seasons. We will be reading National Geographic Kids: A Tree for All Seasons. Our vocabulary words this week are bare, cozy, bud, collect, and chilly. We will review all previously learned letter sounds, and focus on learning /p/ and /n/. In handwriting, we have been practicing horizontal lines, vertical lines, and both backward and forward circles. Now we are moving on to perfecting our letters! This week I will start to send home sight words. These words are high-frequency words that are currently (based on what letter sounds we have or haven't learned) or always (like in the word "said" /ai/ never says /e/) non-decodable. Please practice pointing these words out nightly while you are reading. Have a great week! -Mrs. Stewart

1st/2nd: We are starting to get into the swing of things and have been working hard! This week in 1st grade we will read the story Chrysanthemum by Kevin Henkes, and discuss how important it is to just be ourselves. We will go over characters, settings, main details in a story as well as details that support the main idea. In math we are continuing to work on writing and identifying numbers 1-20 and basic shapes and their sides. This week we will be talking about the penny (what it looks like and how much it's worth). In 2nd grade we will read the story The Salamander Room by Anne Mazer. We will talk about summarizing a story, mental images (visualizing while you read), and go over adjectives. In math we will continue working on math facts, finishing a pattern, showing a given time on a clock, ordinal numbers, and

shapes with equal sizes. I hope everyone has a great week! - Mrs. Thomas

3rd/4th: I was able to get out and enjoy the weather this weekend and I hope you did too! Stanford testing starts this week. Our class will be testing during our normal math time. Students will not have new math lessons this week but I still want them practicing their math facts. It is not only vital that they know the facts, but also that they know them quickly. Please practice subtraction. This is where many students are struggling. We will have our normal spelling tests this week. There will be a pretest on Wednesday and a regular test on Friday. In Science, we will wrap up chapter 2. Study guides will be completed and go home on Monday. Our test will be on Thursday. Please, let me know, if you have any questions. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: 5th and 6th graders will be taking the Stanford test this week. Please make sure to get plenty of rest and eat a good breakfast, so you can do your best on the test. Both grades will finish their unit over the Constitution this week with a project about the Preamble. In Science, 5th grade will start a new chapter over "Classification" and 6th grade will have a test on Friday over Ch. 2. In English, 5th grade will start a unit over nouns and 6th grade will be looking at complex sentences. In Reading, students will be making predictions and drawing conclusions. In Social Studies, 5th grade will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 1 L. 1 & 2 and 6th grade will test next Tuesday over Ch. 1. Students should be on track to pass their 2nd AR book by this Friday. **Parents: Please make sure your child is reading every night so they can meet this goal.**

7th/8th Comm. Arts.: Students will be looking at character elements this week and will also start writing their Patriot's Pen essays. - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: In fifth grade, students are looking at story problems with subtraction patterns, multiplication of larger numbers, and looking at the nature of division. In sixth grade, students are looking at negative integers, story problems with multiplication patterns, and rounding and estimation. **Tests This Week:** 5th Math: Thursday

7/8: In grammar, students are brushing up on their knowledge of nouns. This includes common/proper, possessives, singular/plural, etc. In math, seventh grade math students are looking at customary and metric units of measurements, the use of protractors, and similar/congruent shapes. In pre-algebra, students are working on least common multiples of larger numbers, the use of average, and unit multipliers to help make conversions. In algebra, students are working with all operations of algebraic terms and exponents with negatives. Stanford tests will begin this week. Please help your children to get off to a good start each morning. **Tests This Week:** 8th Science: Tuesday, Algebra: Thursday, 7th Math: Friday -Mr. Ewing
