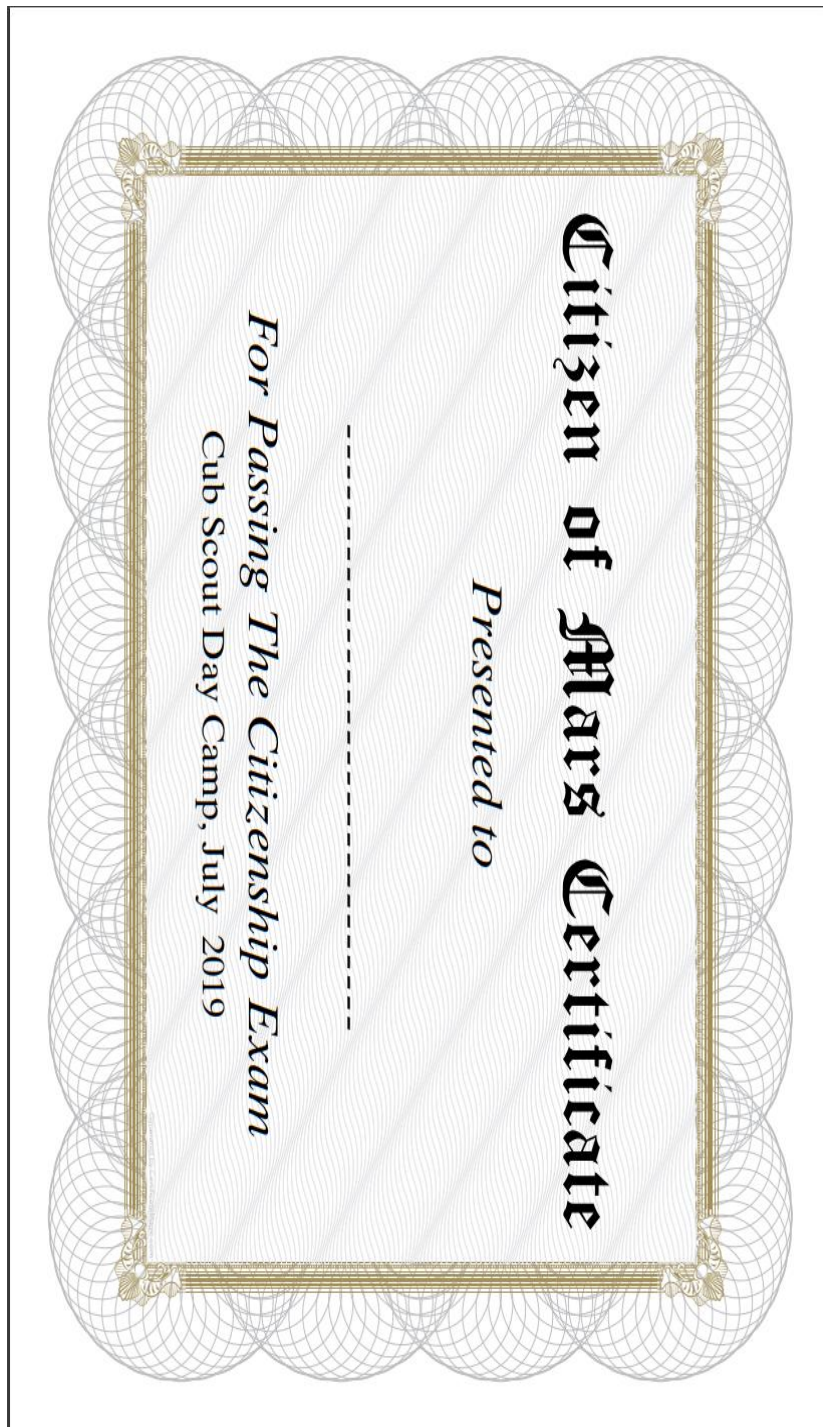

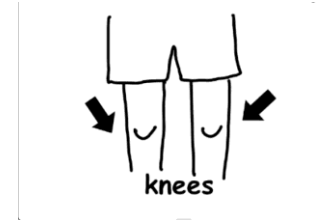
STEM Program Information –

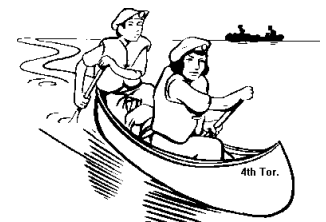

How many Seconds in a Day?



There are 31,556,926 seconds in a year.

The first mechanical clocks, employing the verge escapement mechanism with a foliot or balance wheel timekeeper, were invented in Europe at around the start of the 14th century, and became the standard timekeeping device until the pendulum clock was invented in 1656.

1656 – That's 363 Years ago!

A year goes by 15 microseconds faster at the top of Mount Everest than it does at sea level.

Despite what we've been taught, a day isn't a full 24 hours. It takes 23 hours, 56 minutes, and 4.2 seconds for the earth to rotate once.

- The first fold of our flag is a **symbol of life**.
- The second fold is a symbol of **our belief in eternal life**.
- The third fold is made in honor and **remembrance of the veterans**.
- The fourth fold represents our **trust in God**.
- The fifth fold is a tribute to our country, "**Our Country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right; but it is still our country, right or wrong.**" Stephen Decatur
- The sixth fold is **for where our hearts lie**.
- The seventh fold is a **tribute to our Armed Forces**.
- The eighth fold is a **tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death**, that we might see the light of day, and to honor mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.
- The ninth fold is a **tribute to womanhood**.
- The tenth fold is a **tribute to the father**
- The eleventh fold, **in the eyes of a Hebrew citizen represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon, and glorifies in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob**.
- The twelfth fold, **in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit**.
- The thirteenth fold - When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost reminding us of our nation's motto, "**In God We Trust**".



After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it takes on the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under General George Washington, and the sailors and marines who served under Captain John Paul Jones, who were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the Armed Forces of the United States, preserving for us the rights, privileges, and freedoms we enjoy today.
